Agenda: Monthly meeting of Quality Managers to discuss ranking criteria of NIRF, MOOC and adoption of Social Responsibilities for KGMU.

Minutes of Monthly meeting of Quality managers was held on 26-09-2020 on zoom panel to discuss NIRF, MOOC and adoption of social responsibilities for KGMU. Meeting was attended by



- 1. As National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) site will open for data entry in October, KGMU's last year's entry sheet was compared with that of AIIMS, New Delhi and found that details of students going for higher students has to be gathered for accurate entry. Seeing this gap in information, it IS requested to allow Dean QP office to provide NOC to students, before their final NOC in registrar office to be able to track their progress.
- 2. Number of PhD students at KGMU is meagre (17 in one year) looking at that of AIIMS (255 in 2018, 293 in 2017, and 228 in 2016. This shows the need to increase quality PhD students to enroll at KGMU. It is suggested to have different types of PhD programs including part time PhD, integrated PhD, Independent PhD. Part time PhD can have 1 extended year, and may be allowed to students staying outside Lucknow, and even International students can be enrolled in such programs.

Integrated PhD can be allowed to our postgraduate students to undertake PhD work along with their PG thesis, with 2 additional years.

Independent PhD for faculty members with more than 3 publications in a year focused on a particular topic.

- 3. Also, it was felt that the eligibility criteria should be eased out. Instead of the clause
 - 4.a.4. Candidates without secure funding will not be registered in PhD rules and regulations at KGMU, any NGO funded, self funded or industry funded students should be allowed to be eligible
- 4. In the eligibility criteria of KGMU PhD rules and regulations, there should also be a weightage scoring for candidates with prior research experience and publications.
- 5. Massive open online courses (MOOC) are being encouraged by Government of India through its Swayam portal. It would be a good opportunity for KGMU to take a leadership role in this MOOC program and present a few online modules for the country on latest topics of interest.



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6. Social outreach cell organizes medical events for the benefit of the society at large and it is proposed if a **Students social outreach (prayaas) club** can propagate our students in such activities round the year, it will help in organizing many more activities with students involvement. Also, if one of our Quality Manager, who has willingly volunteered for this job, can be linked to the social outreach cell for better co-ordination and implementation of the planned activities.

7. It was suggested that as part of our social responsibilities, a village may be adopted for its awareness, training and medical care/ a school may be adopted for regular awareness and training programs / our medical students can start evening classes for our employees children / adopt some centres working for specially challenged children/ our medical students can collect and distribute old clothes and utensils for the poor and slum dwellers.
