 - To ensure the curriculum is aligned with current professional, societal, and technological needs.
 - To institutionalize feedback as an essential component of academic planning and development.
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
3. Stakeholders for Structured Feedback



5. Process of Feedback Collection and Implementation

1. Feedback tools will be standardized and digitally administered.
2. Data will be collected and analyzed by respective Deaneries.
3. Reports shall be shared with Curriculum Review Committees at the faculty level.
4. Recommendations will be tabled in Dean Academic's Board of studies meetings for approval.
5. Approved curricular changes will be implemented in the next academic cycle.

6. Confidentiality and Communication


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- Stakeholder anonymity will be maintained during feedback collection to ensure unbiased responses.
 - A summary of actions taken based on feedback will be published annually on the university website and shared in faculty meetings.

7. Monitoring and Review


- Feedback outcomes and curriculum modifications will be reviewed annually.

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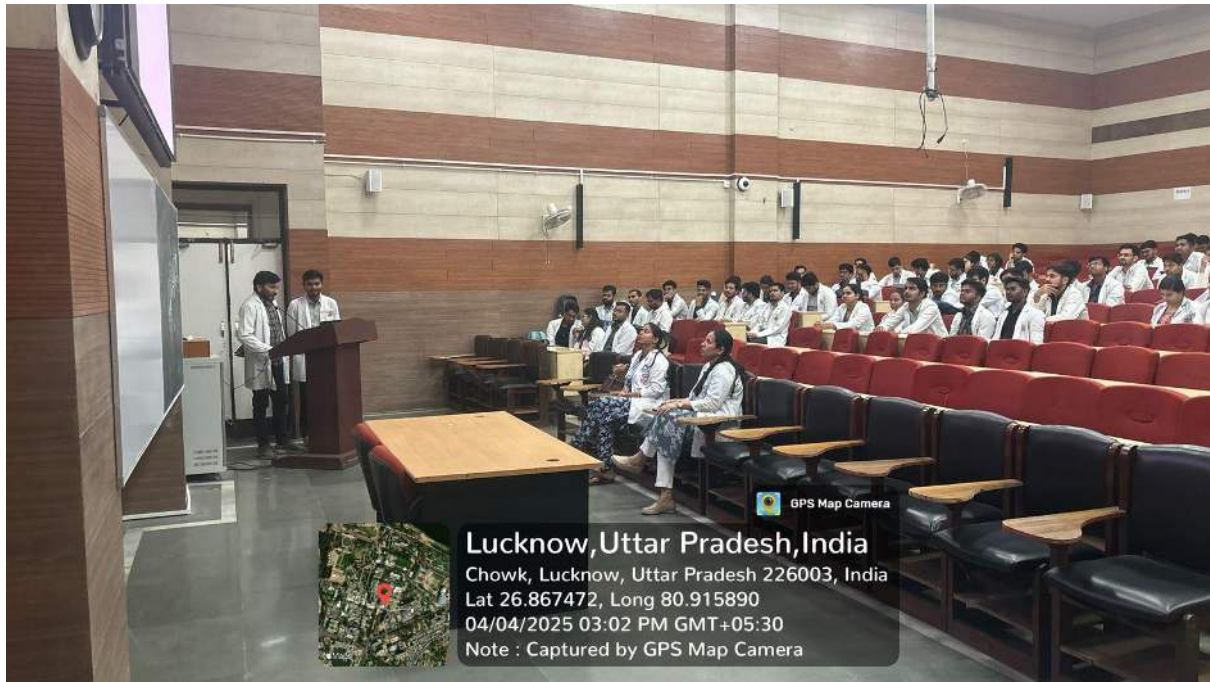

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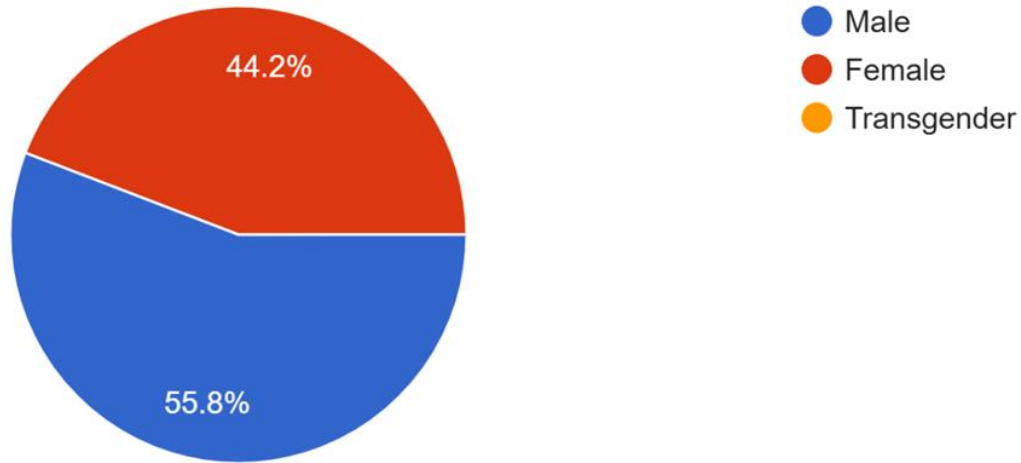

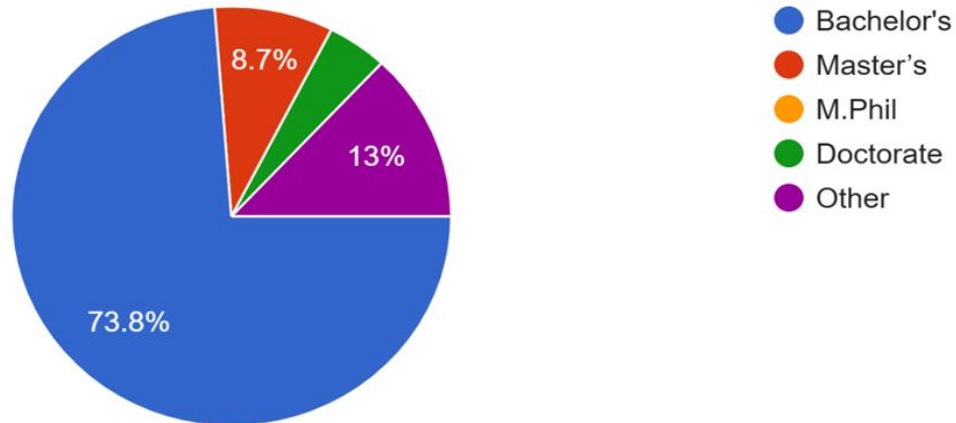

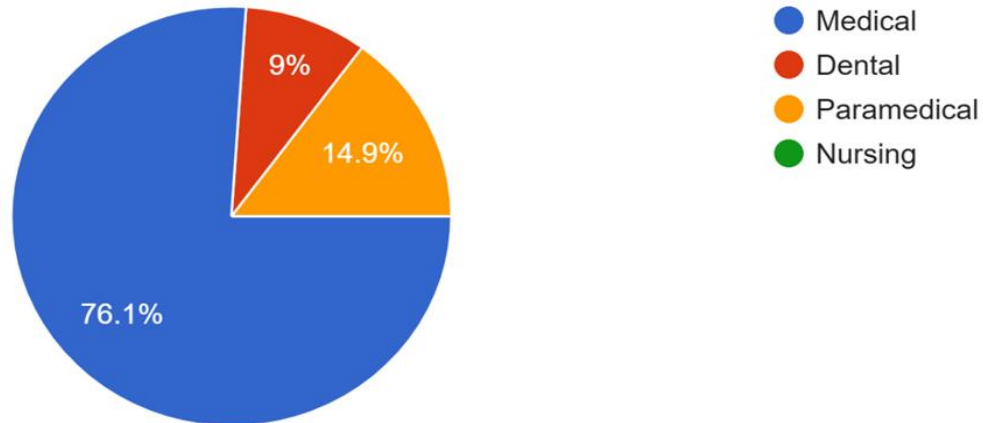

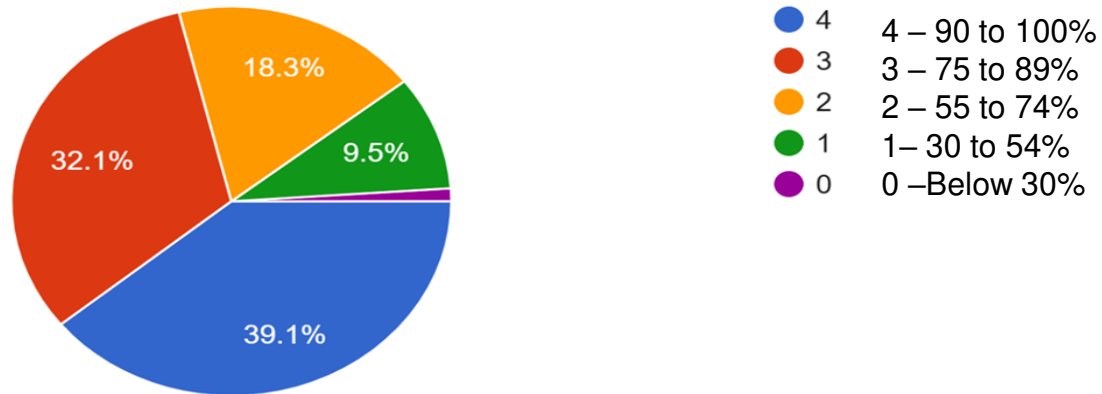

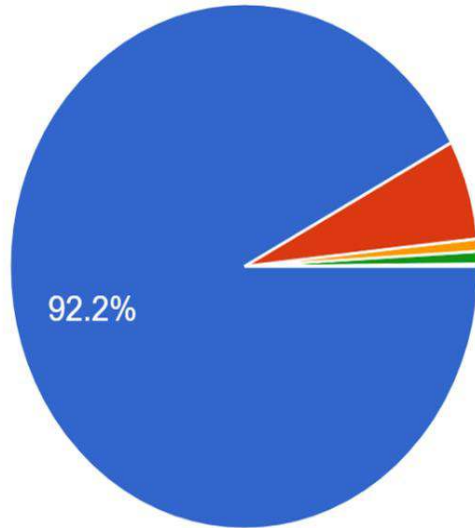

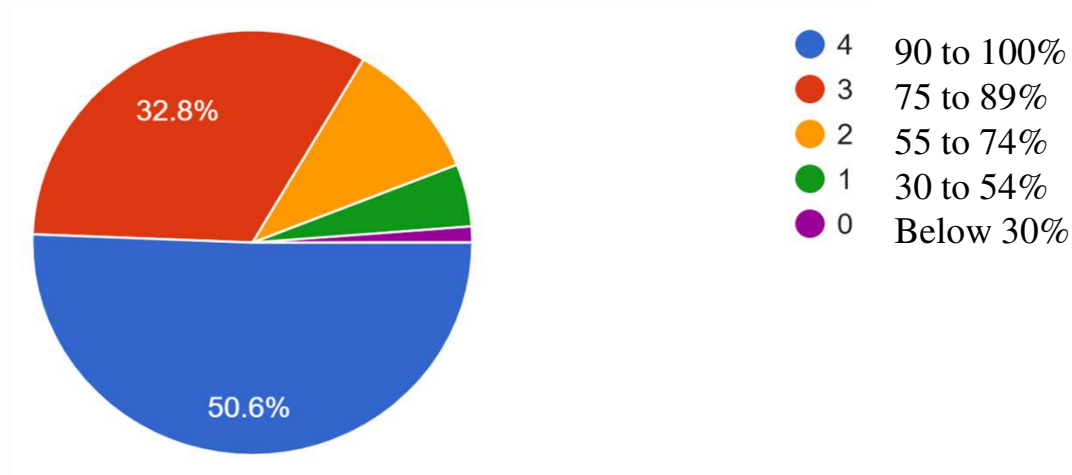

3. What percentage of teachers is effectively communicating domain knowledge using IT skills and Soft Skills in the Teaching Learning Process?

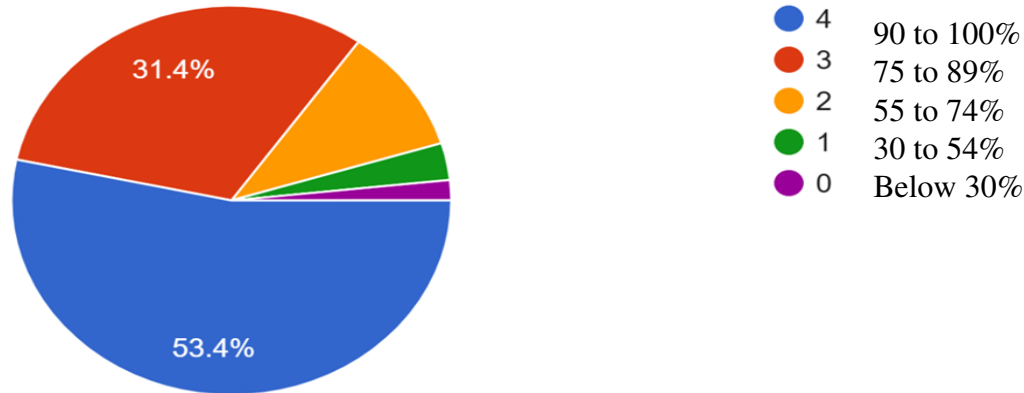

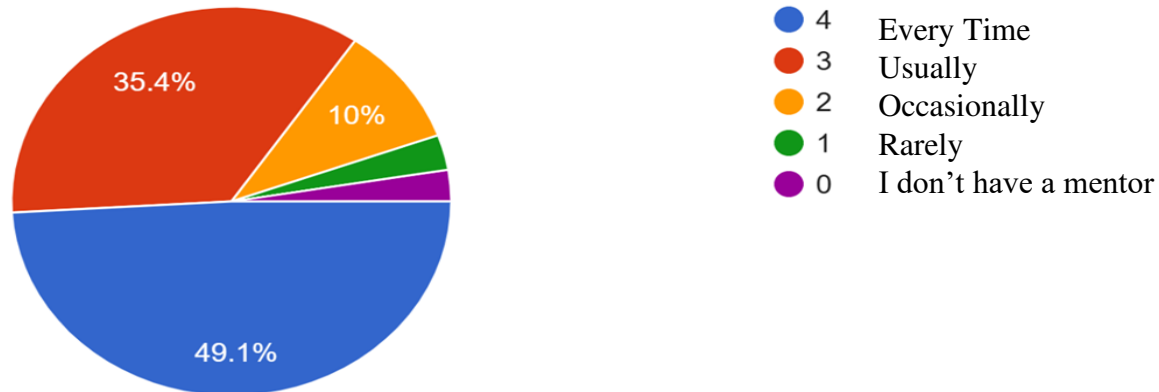

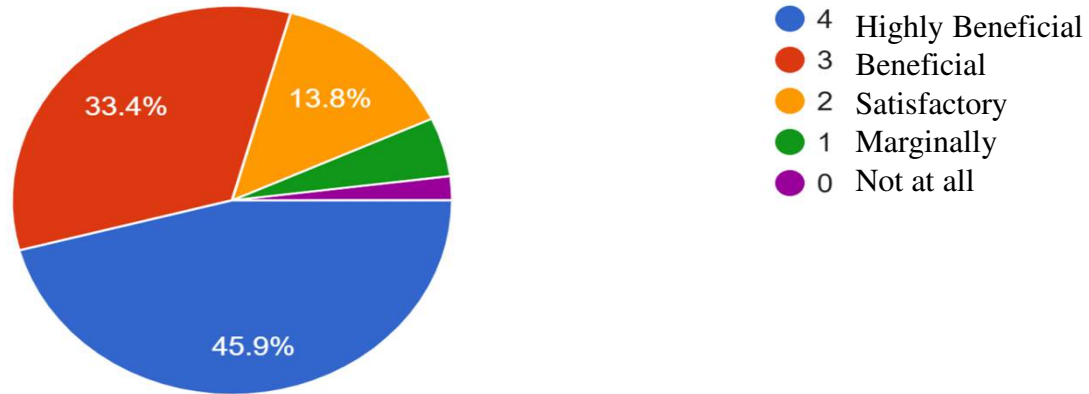

6. To what extent is the mentoring process in your institution beneficial to you for cognitive, social and emotional growth?



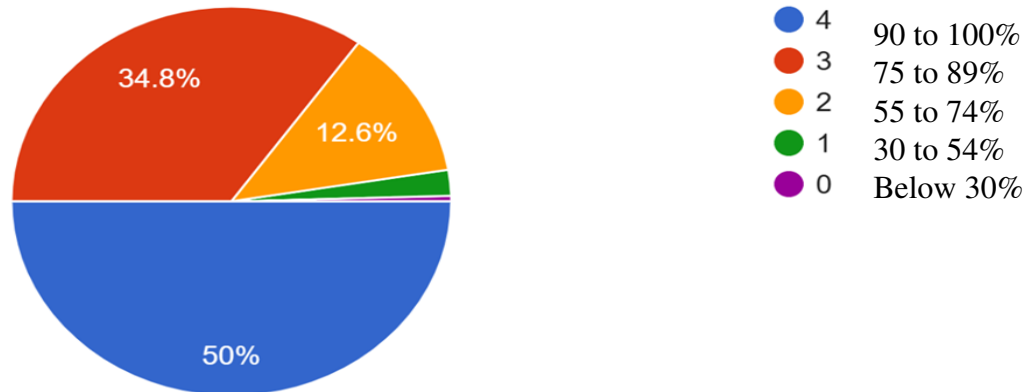

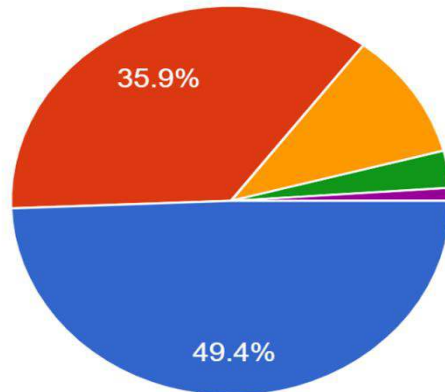

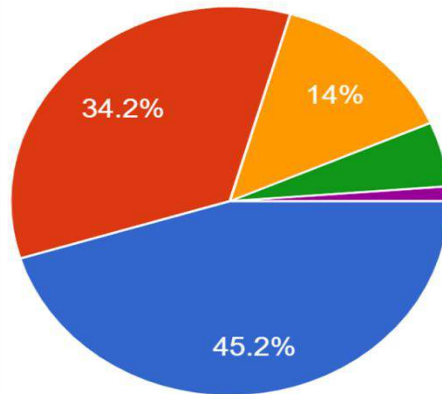

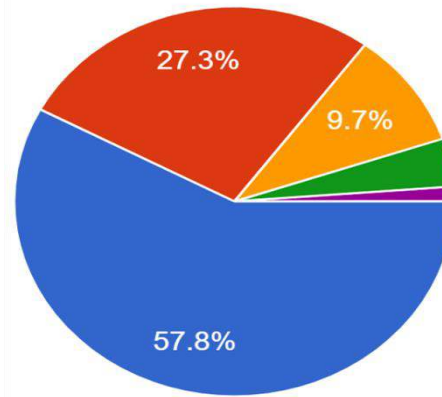

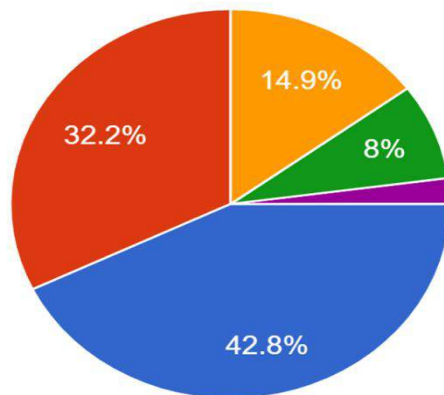

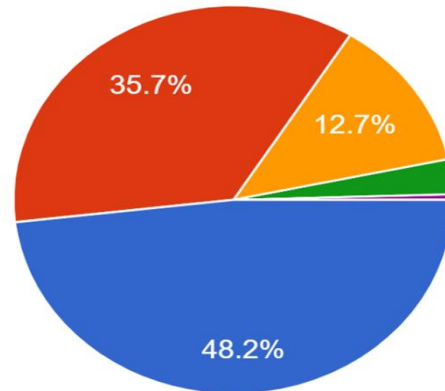

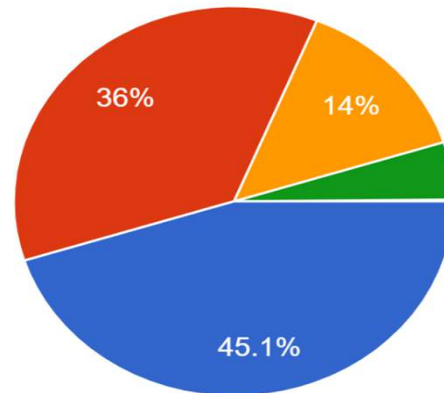

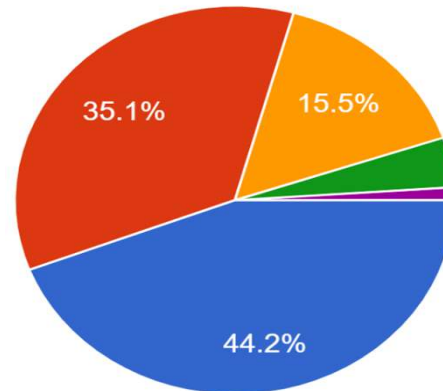

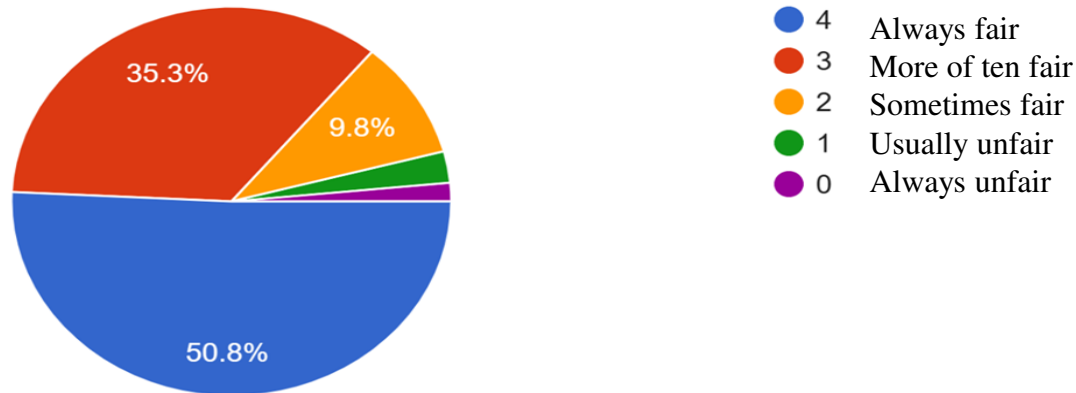

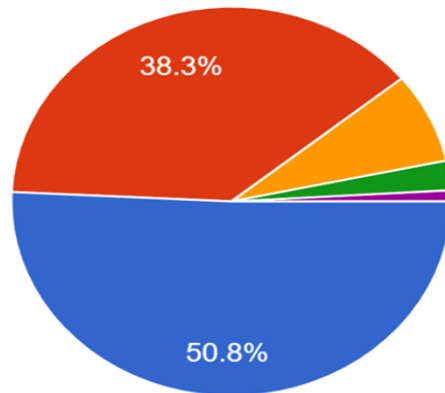

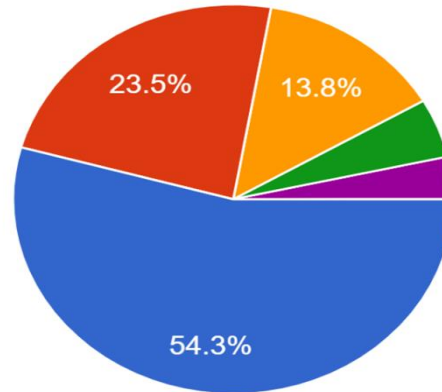

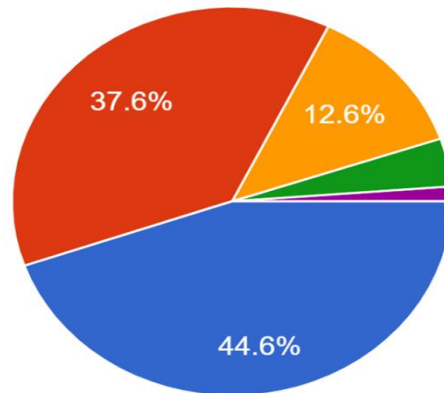

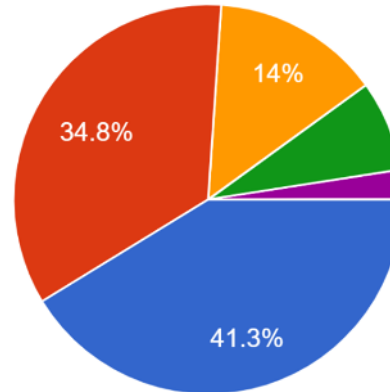

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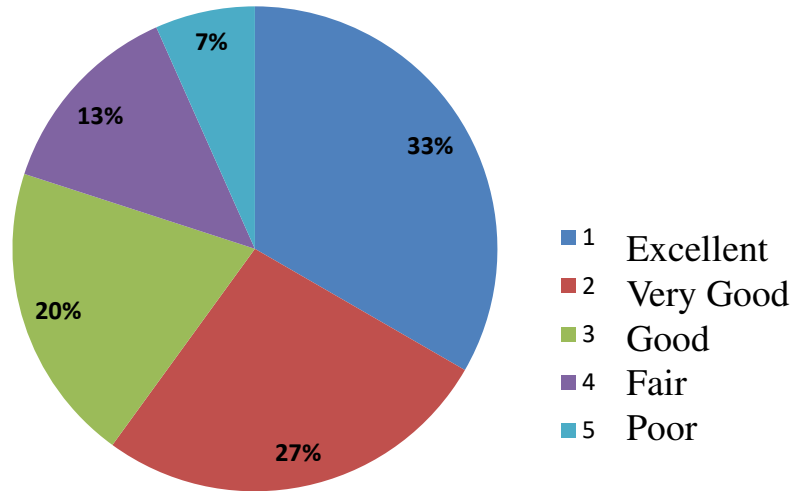

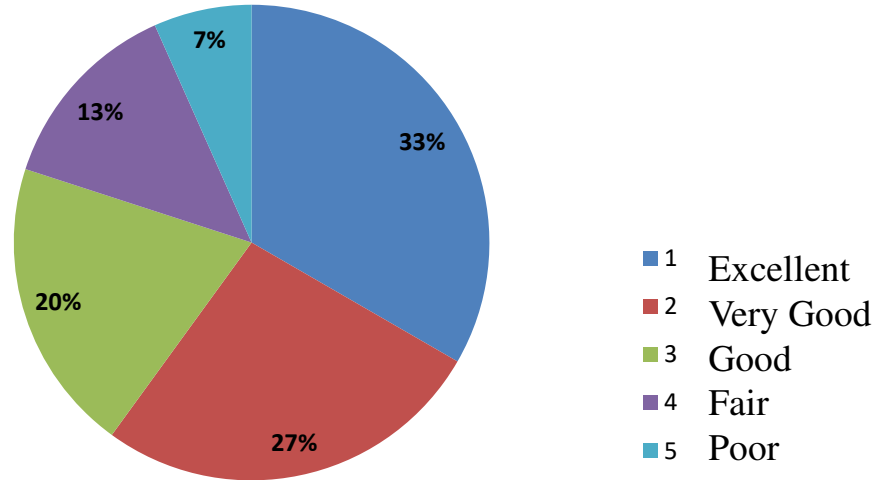

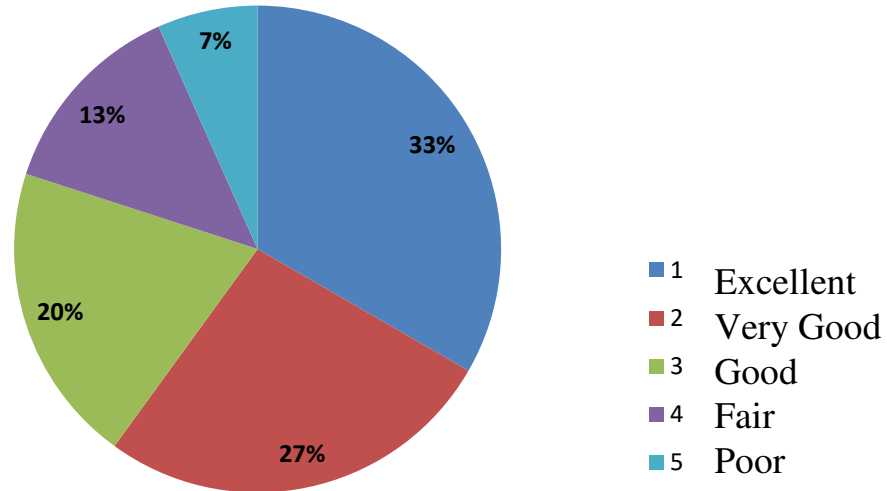

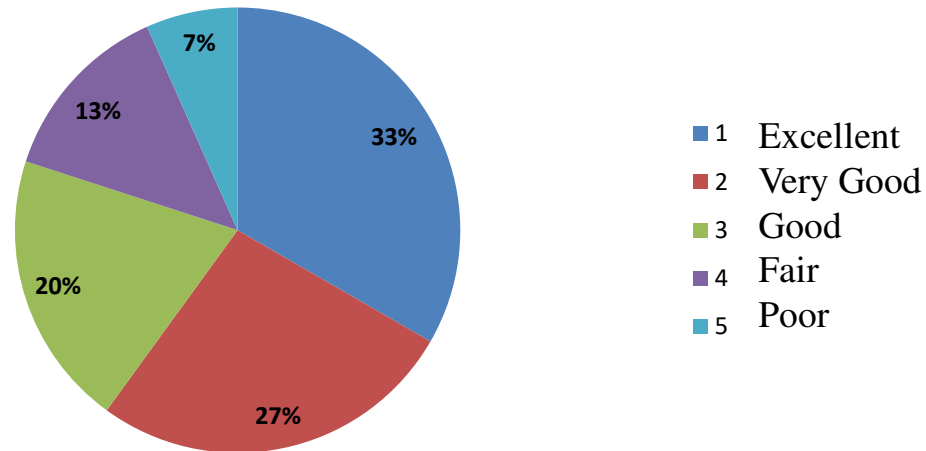

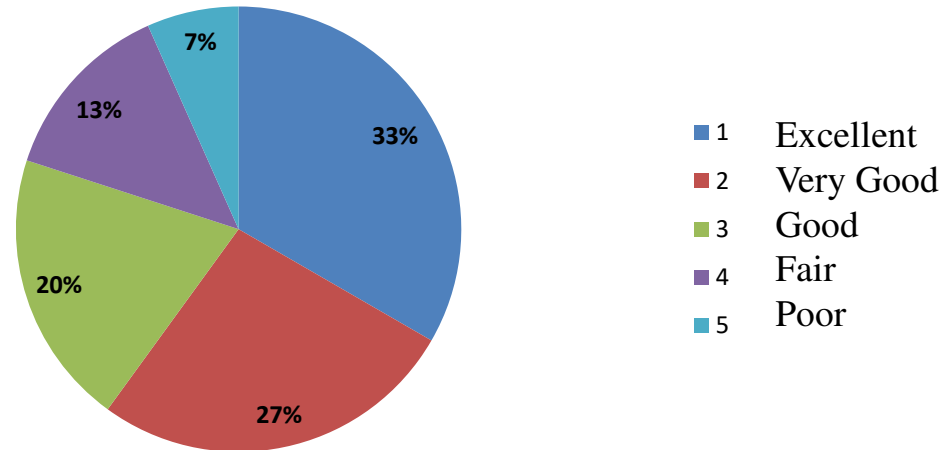

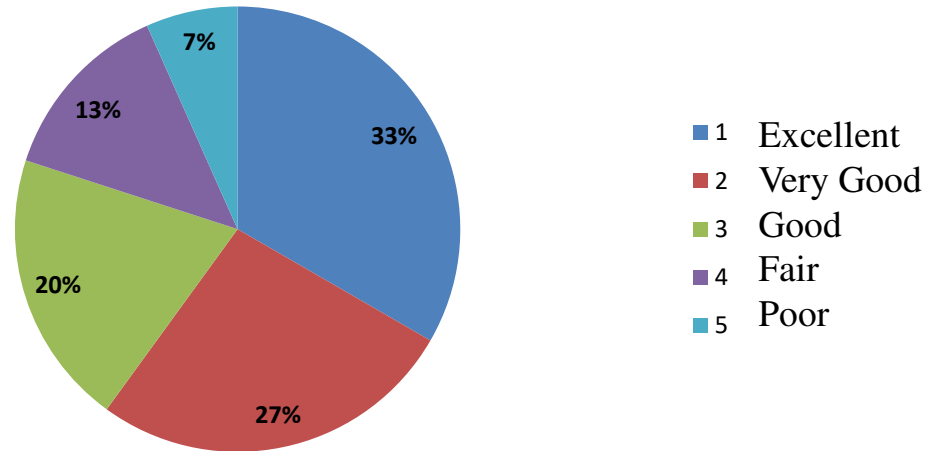

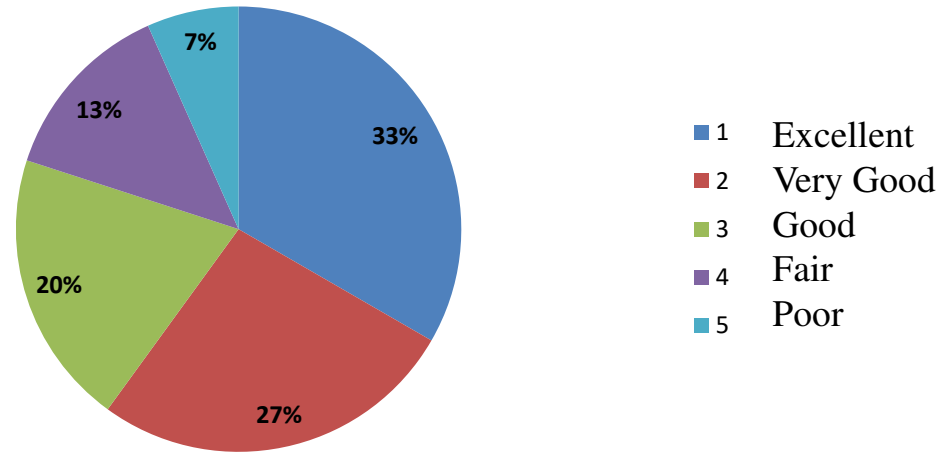

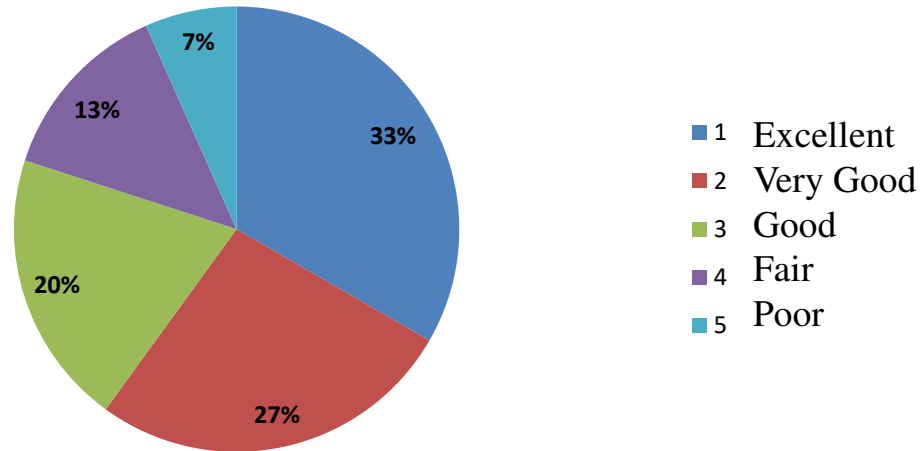

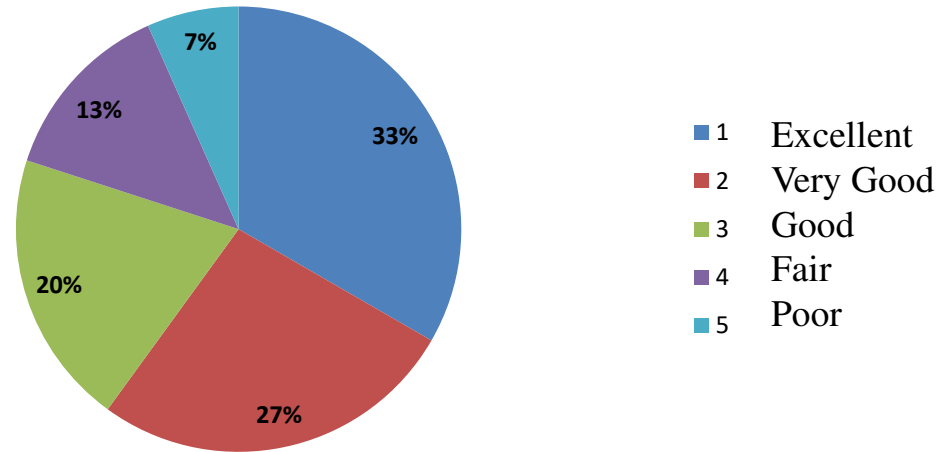

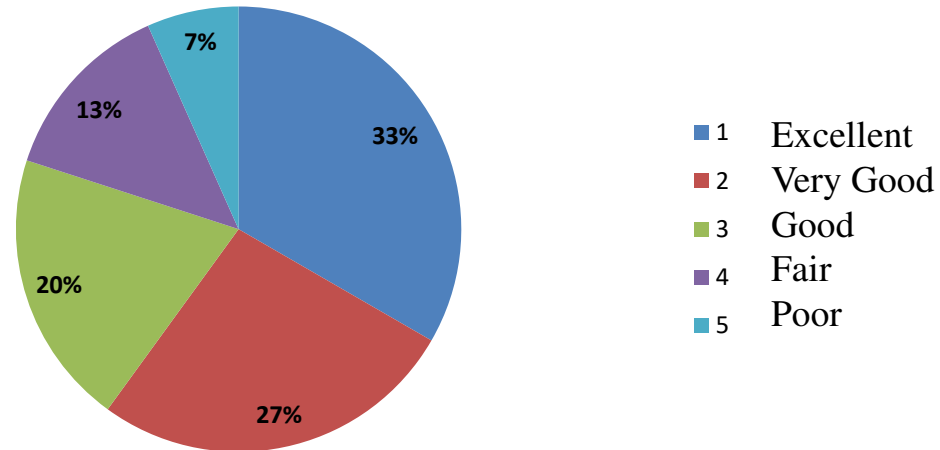

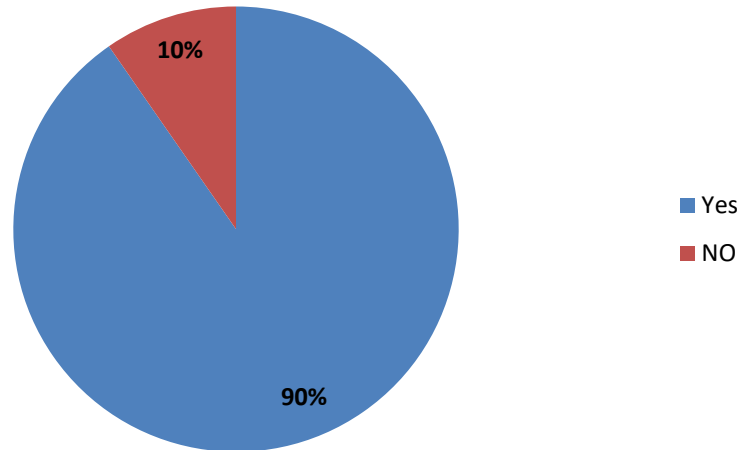

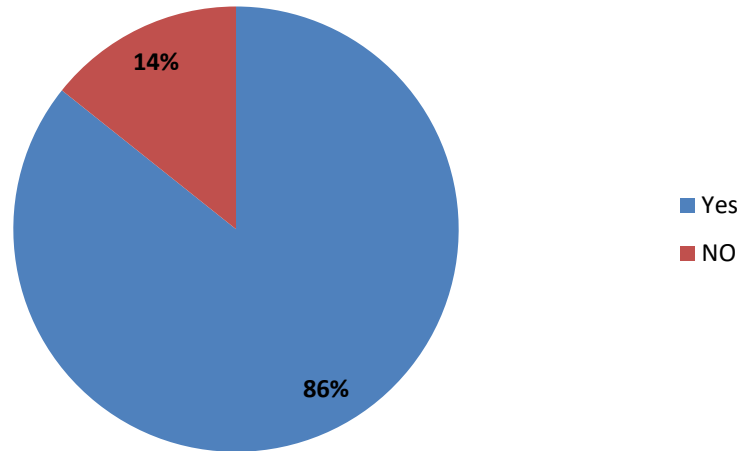

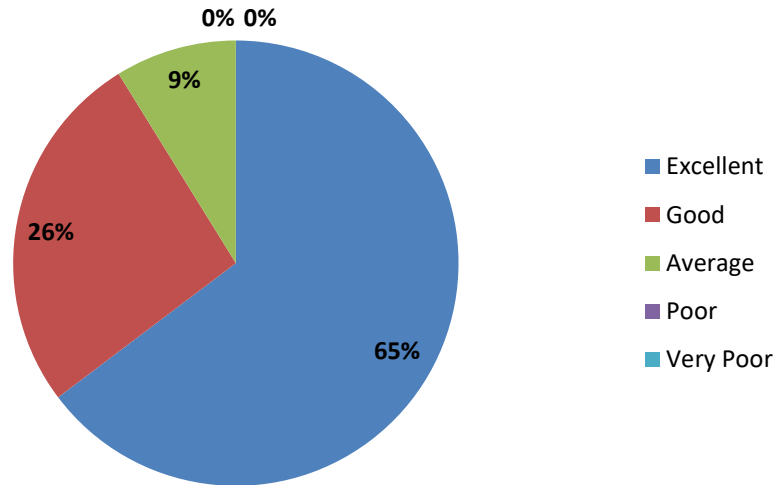

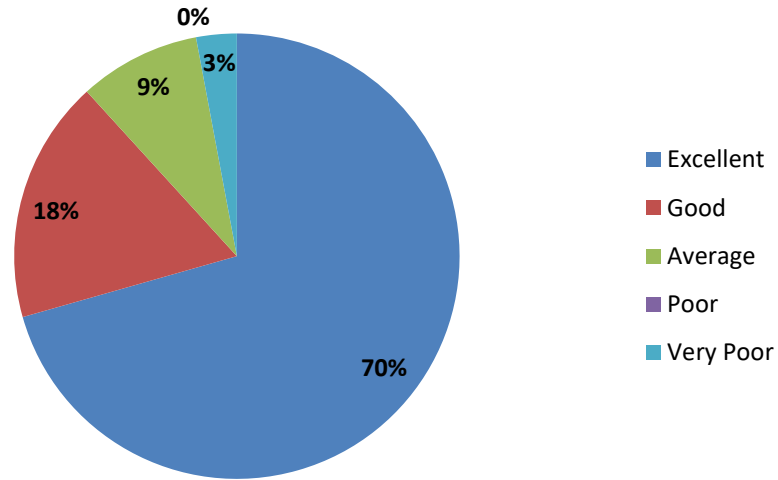

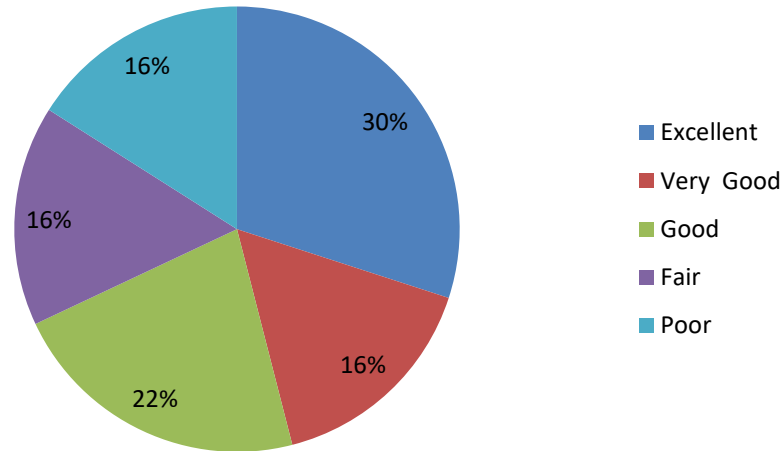

[Confidence]



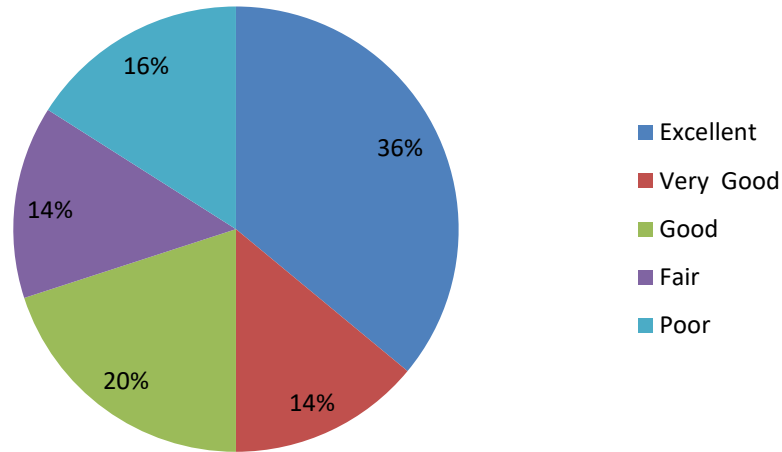

[Adaptability]



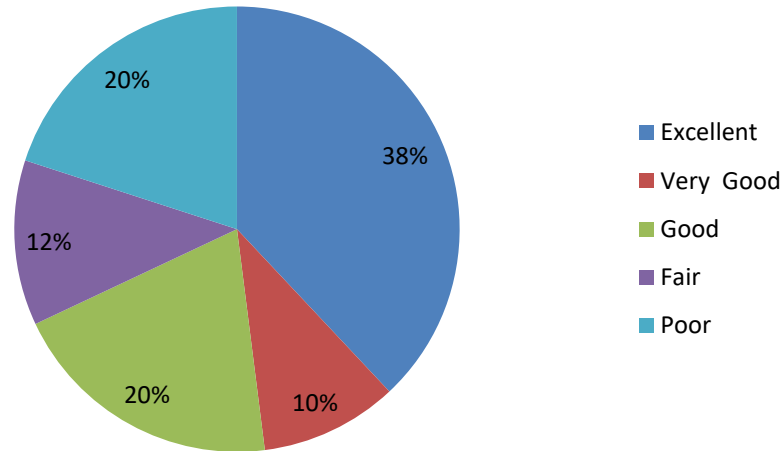

[Professionalism]



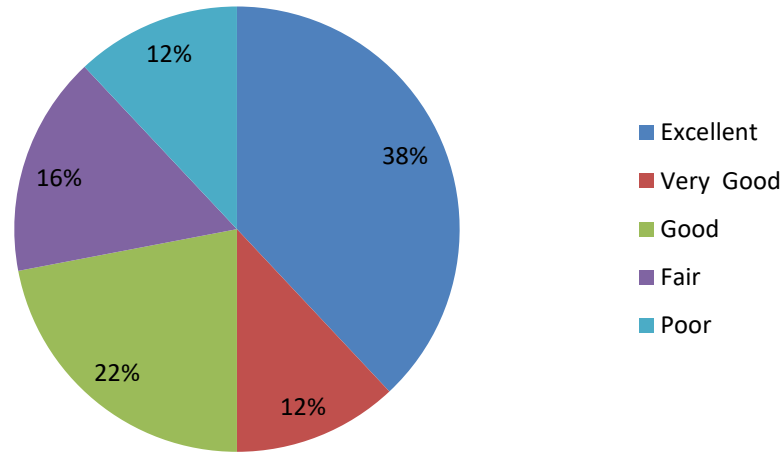

How will you rate the performance of KGMU doctors when they joined you? [Team working]



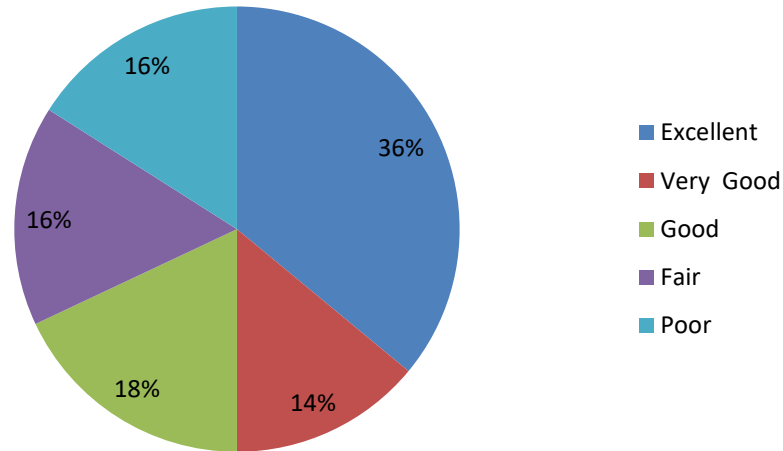

How will you rate the performance of KGMU doctors when they joined you? [Performance]



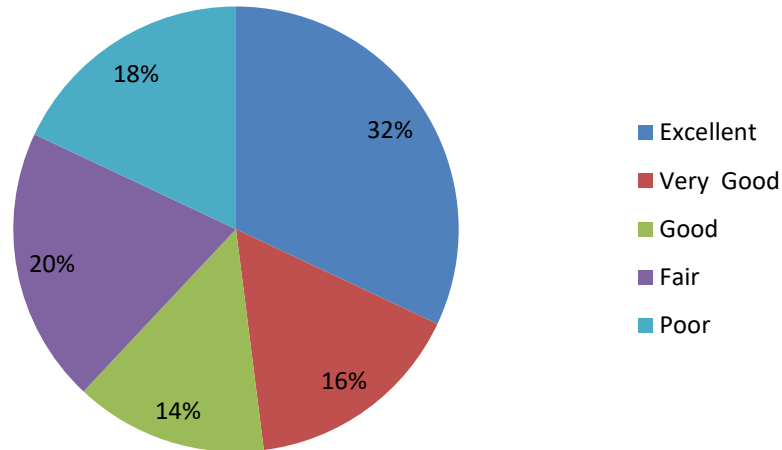

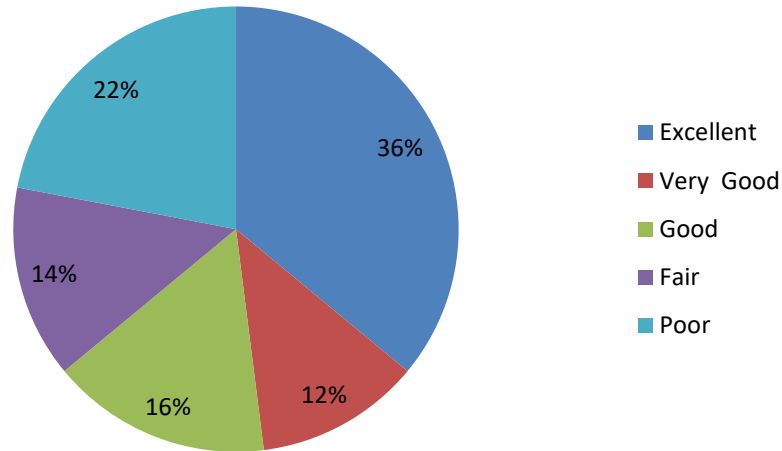

How will you rate the performance of KGMU doctors when they joined you? [Creativity]



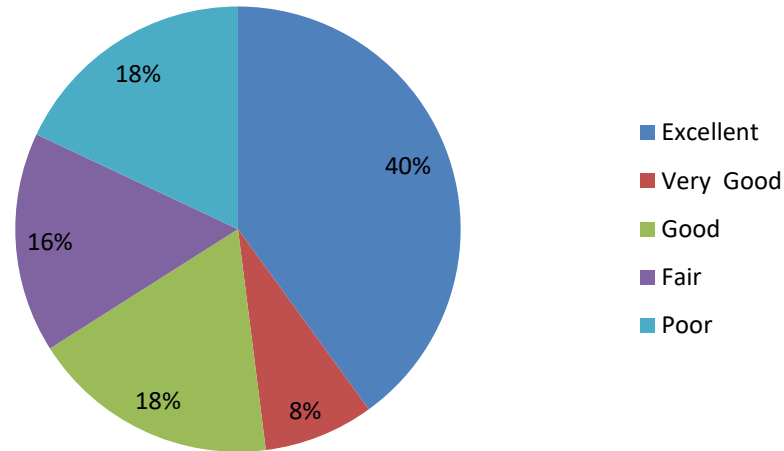

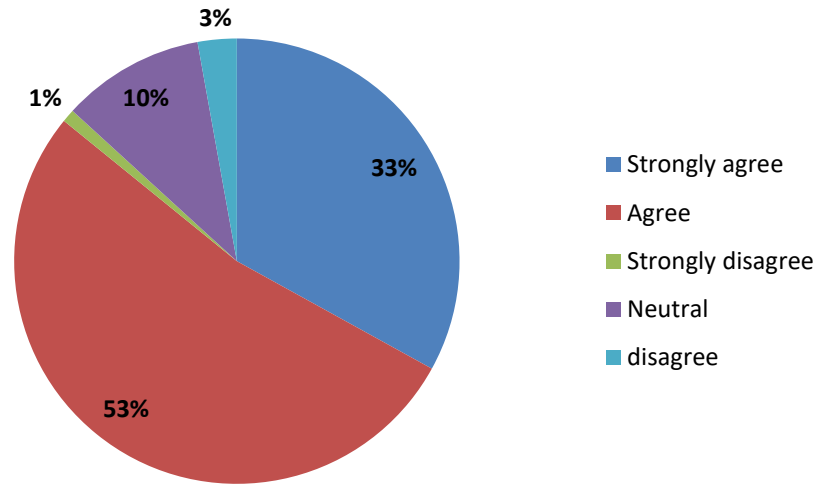

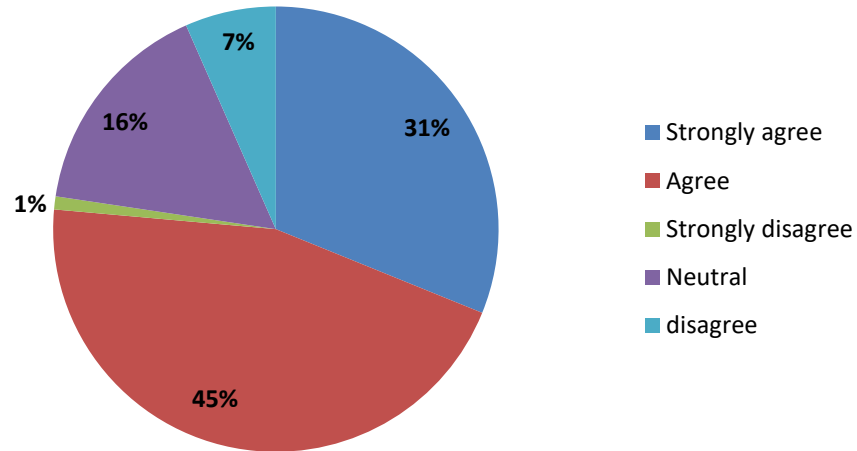

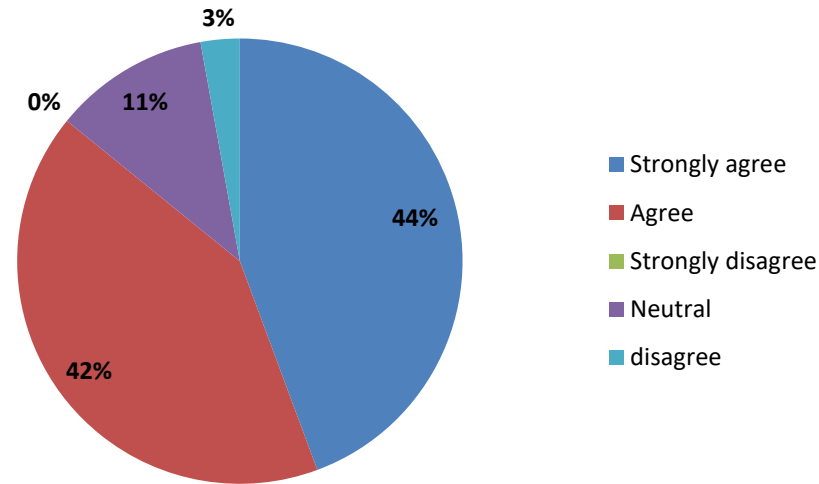

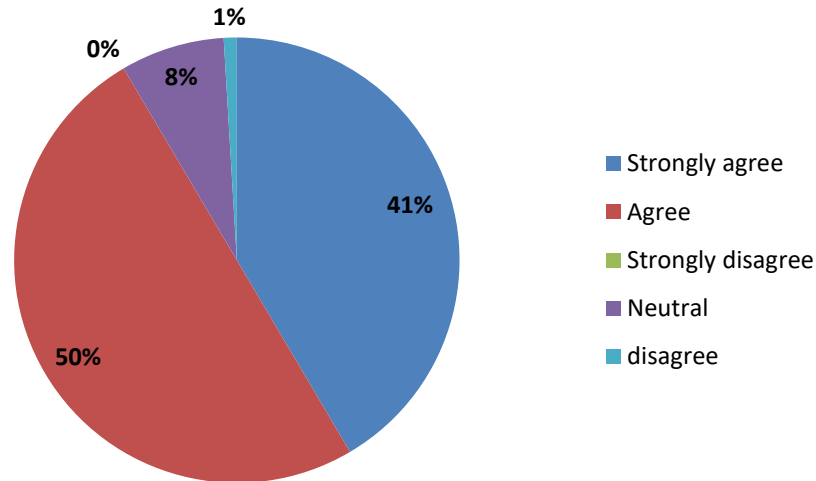

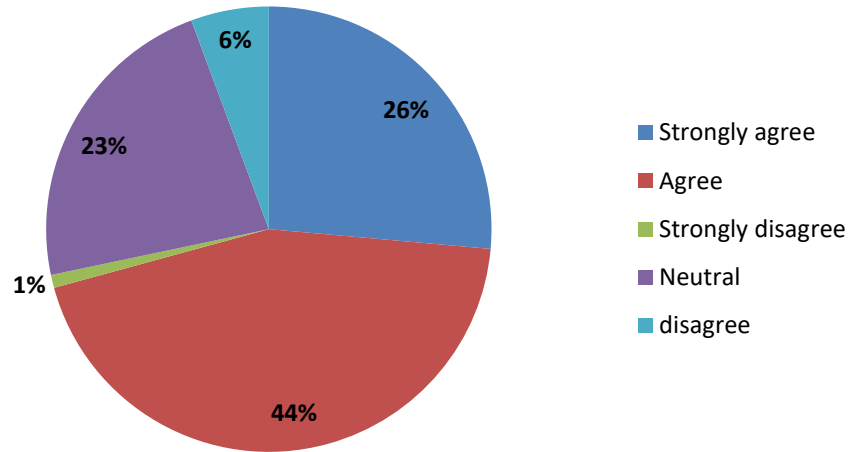




Teachers Perception of Curriculum



The formative and summative assessment methods are adequate

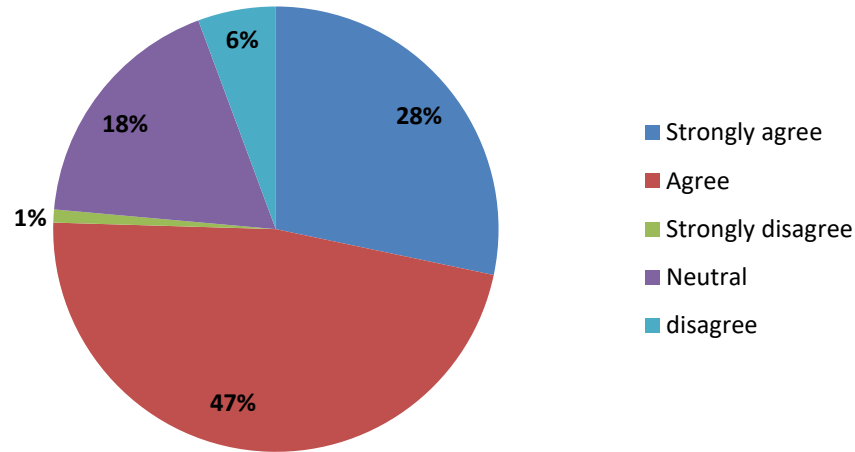




Teachers Perception of Curriculum



The assessment aligns with the pre-defined program objectives

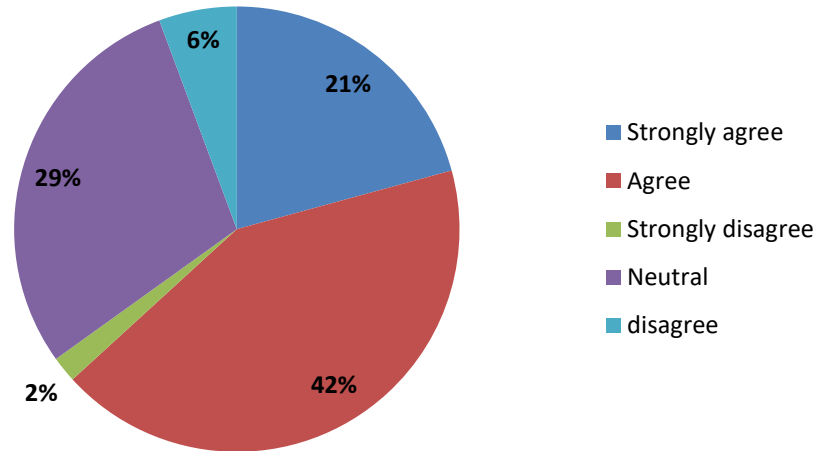

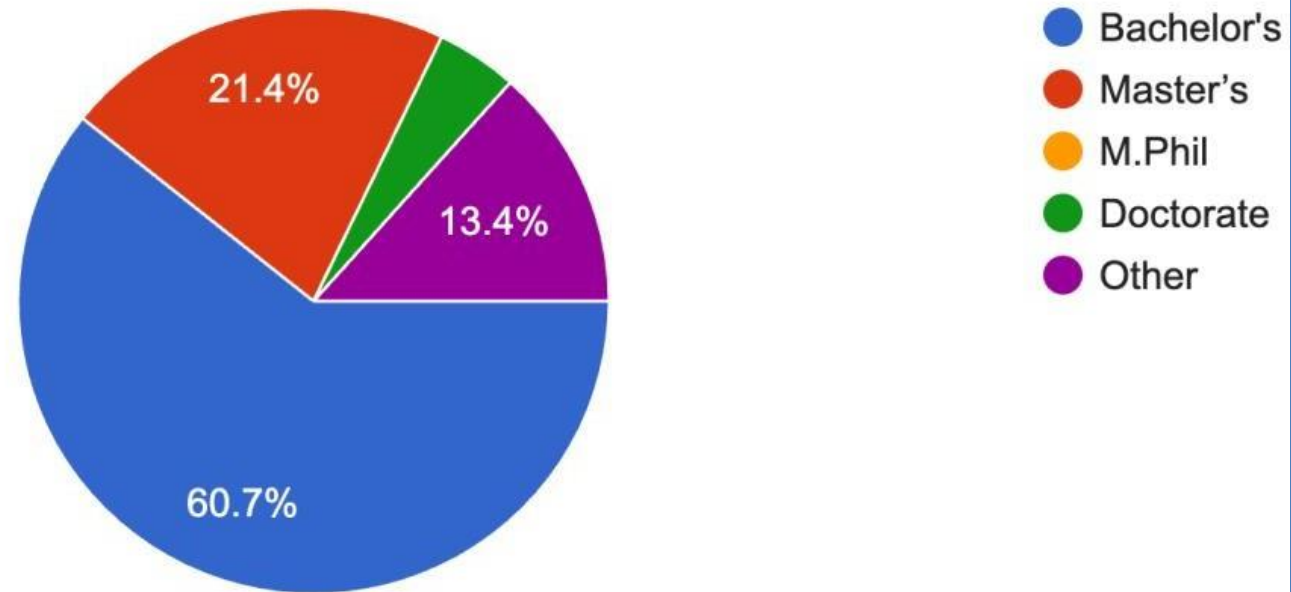

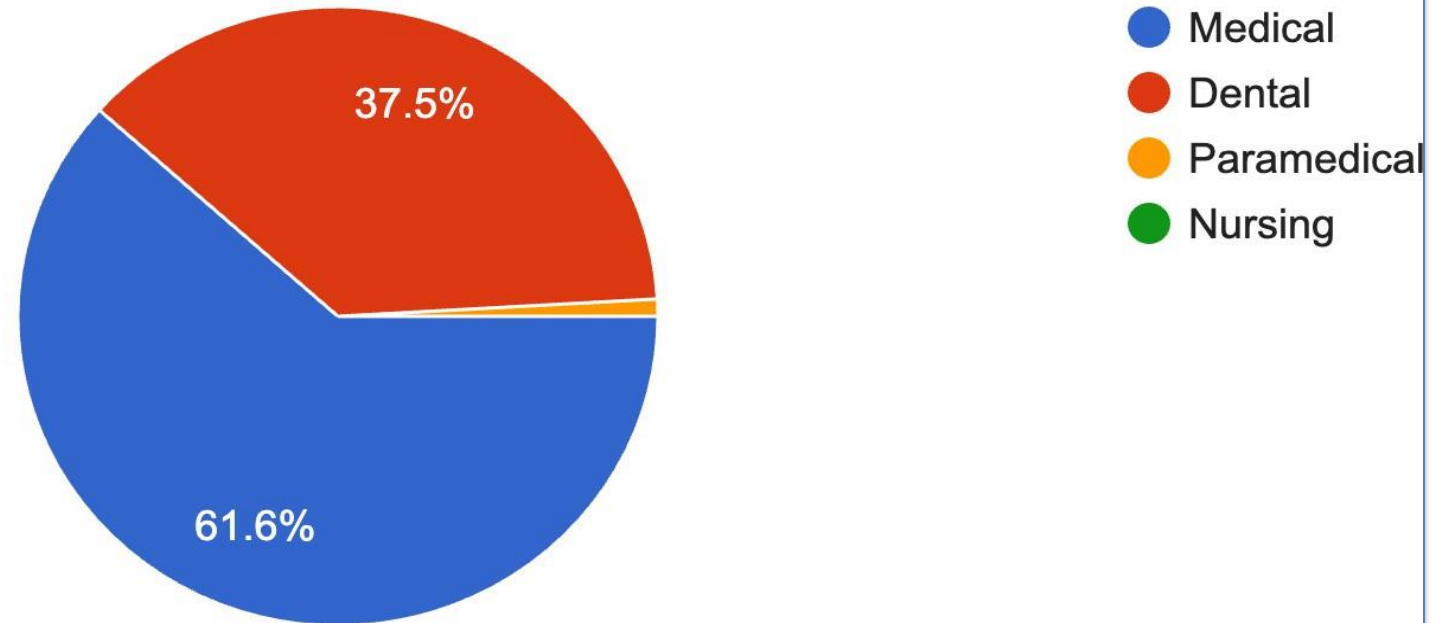

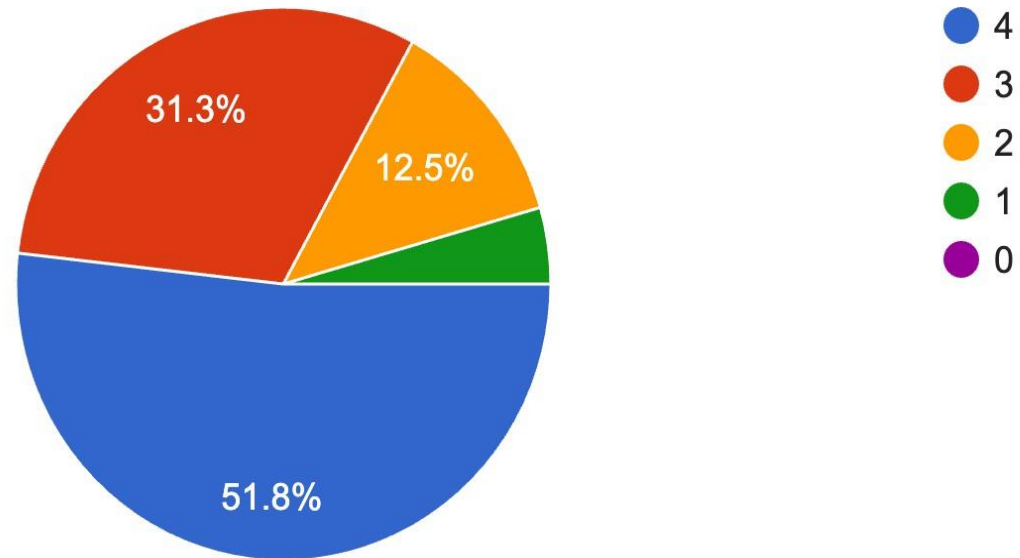

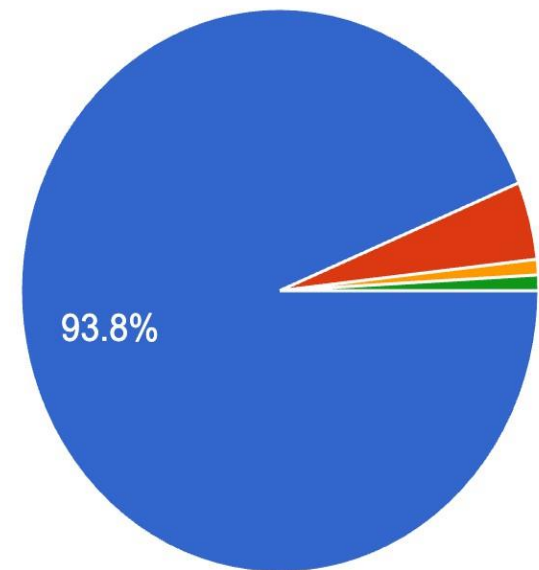

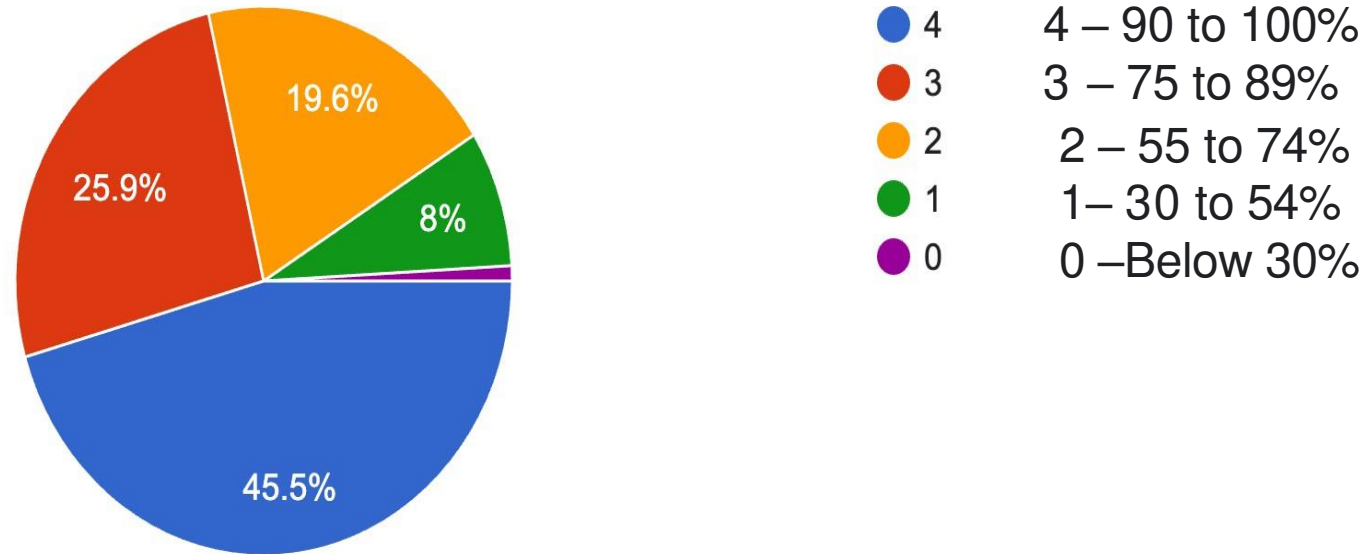

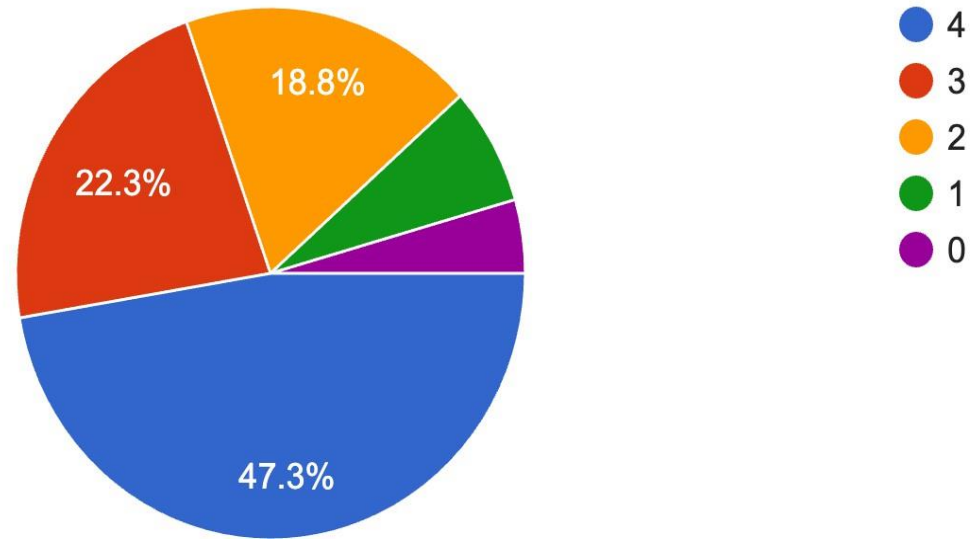

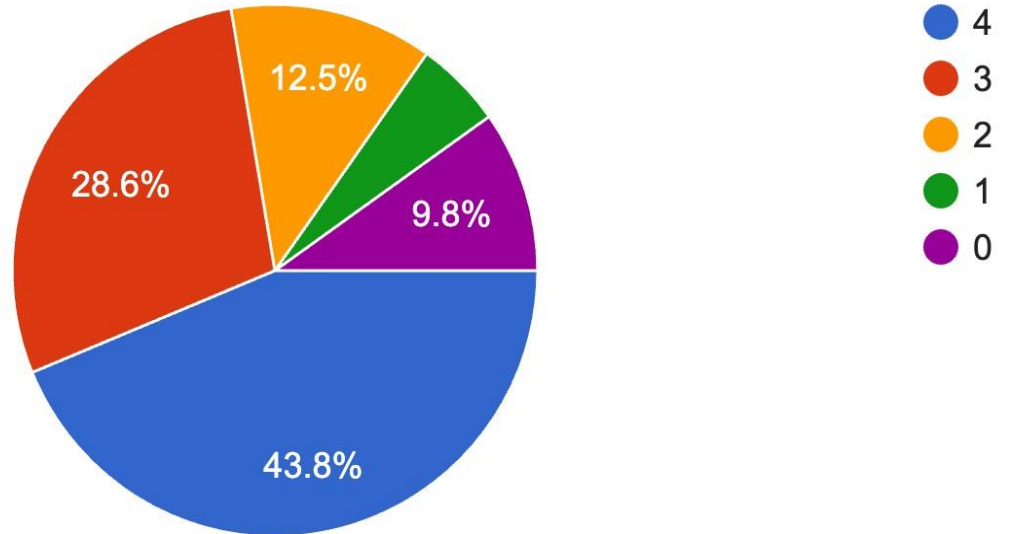

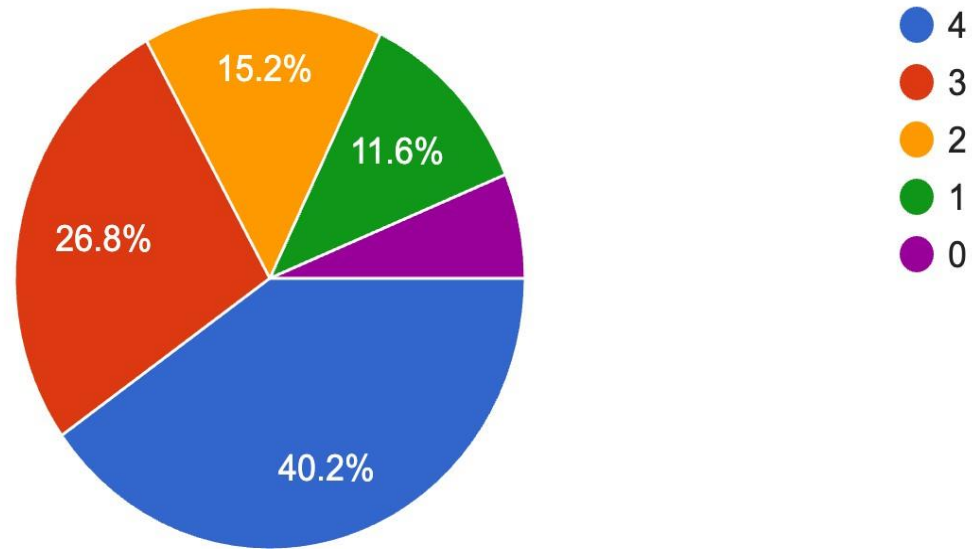

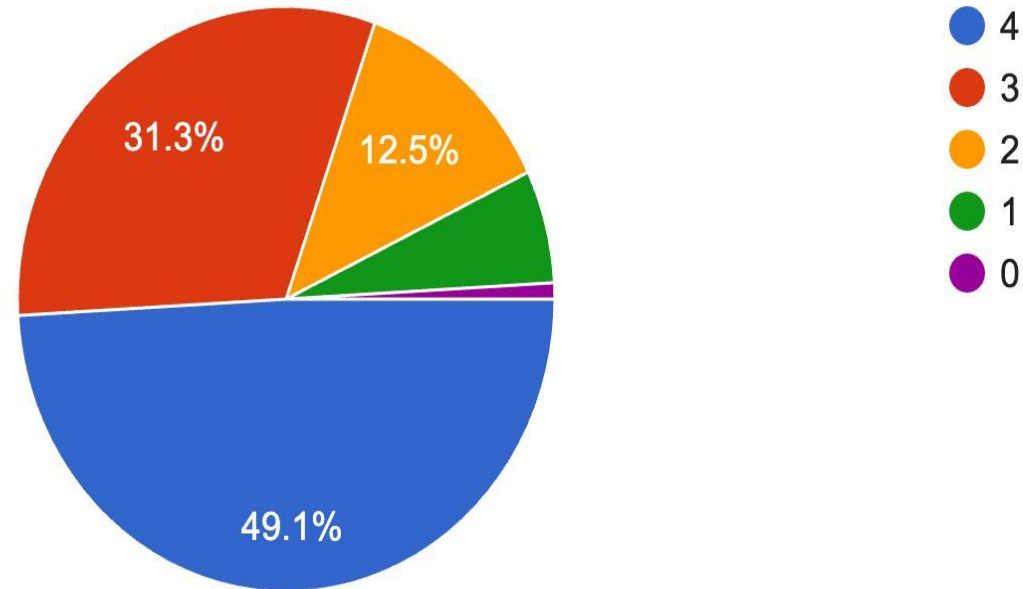

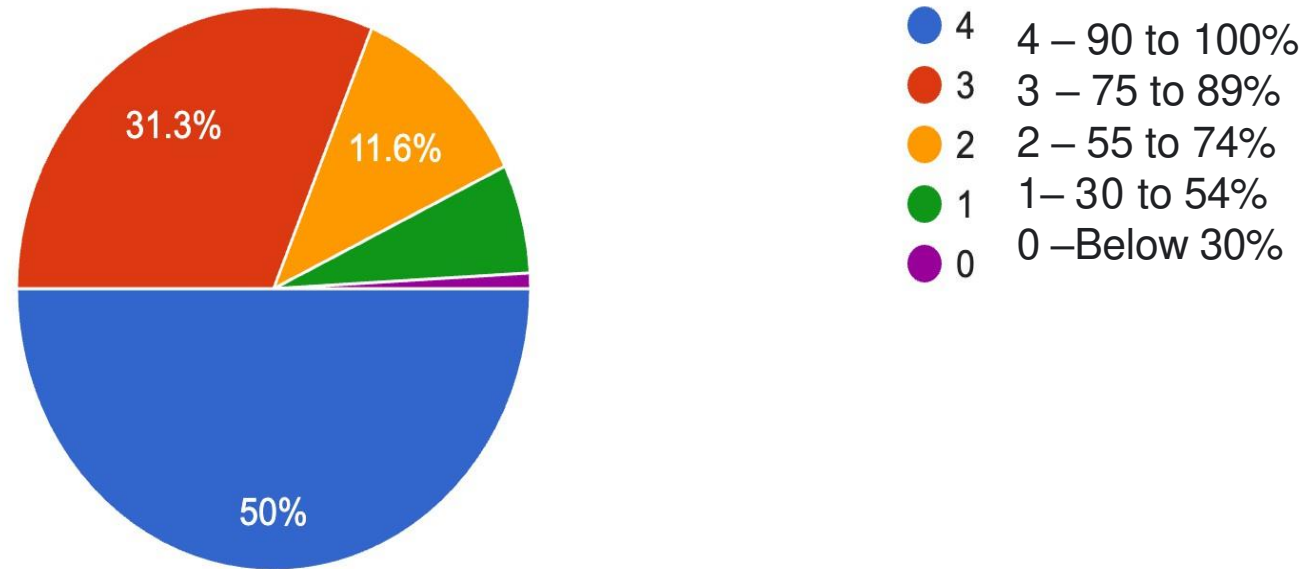

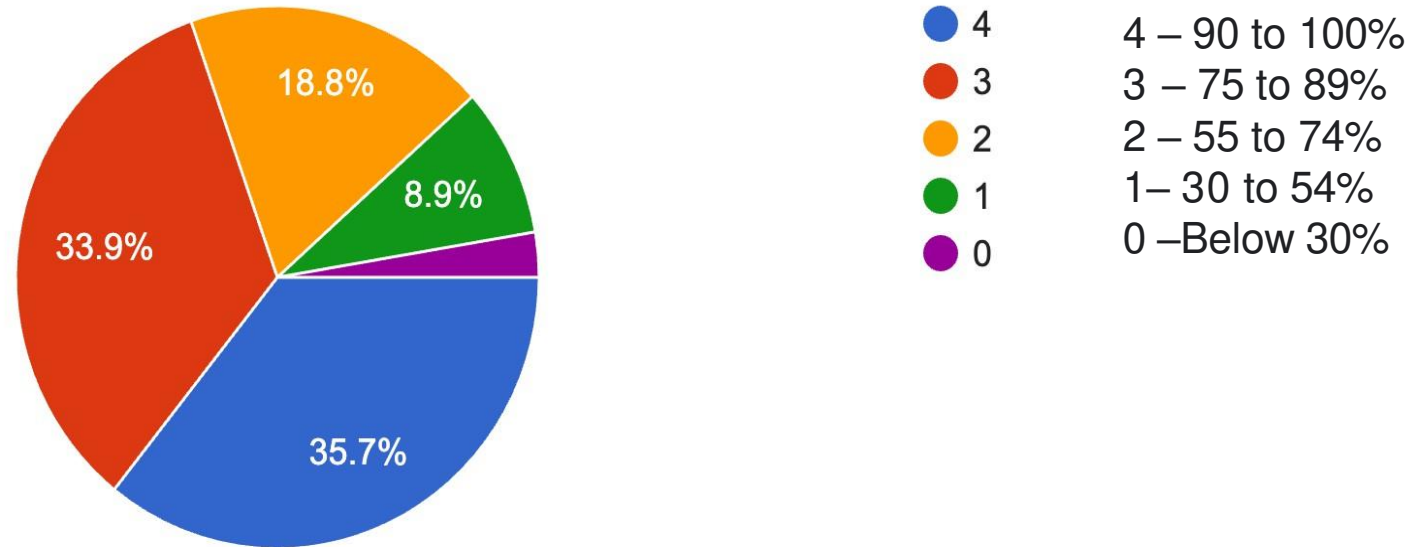

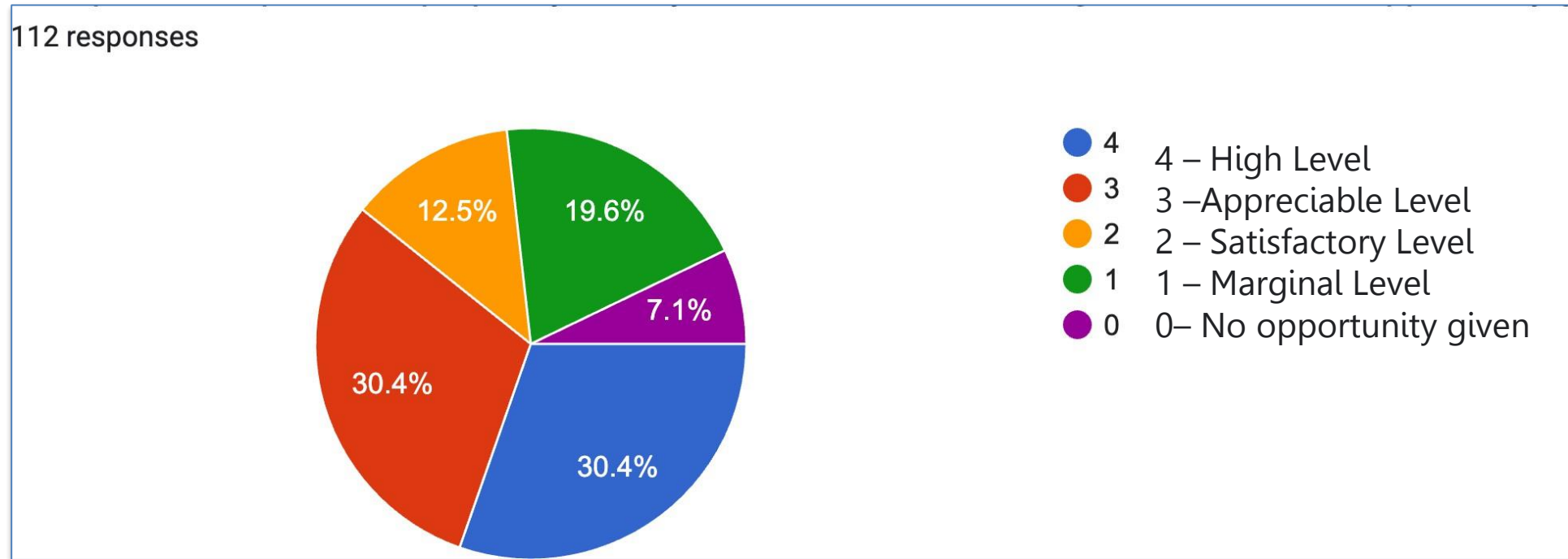

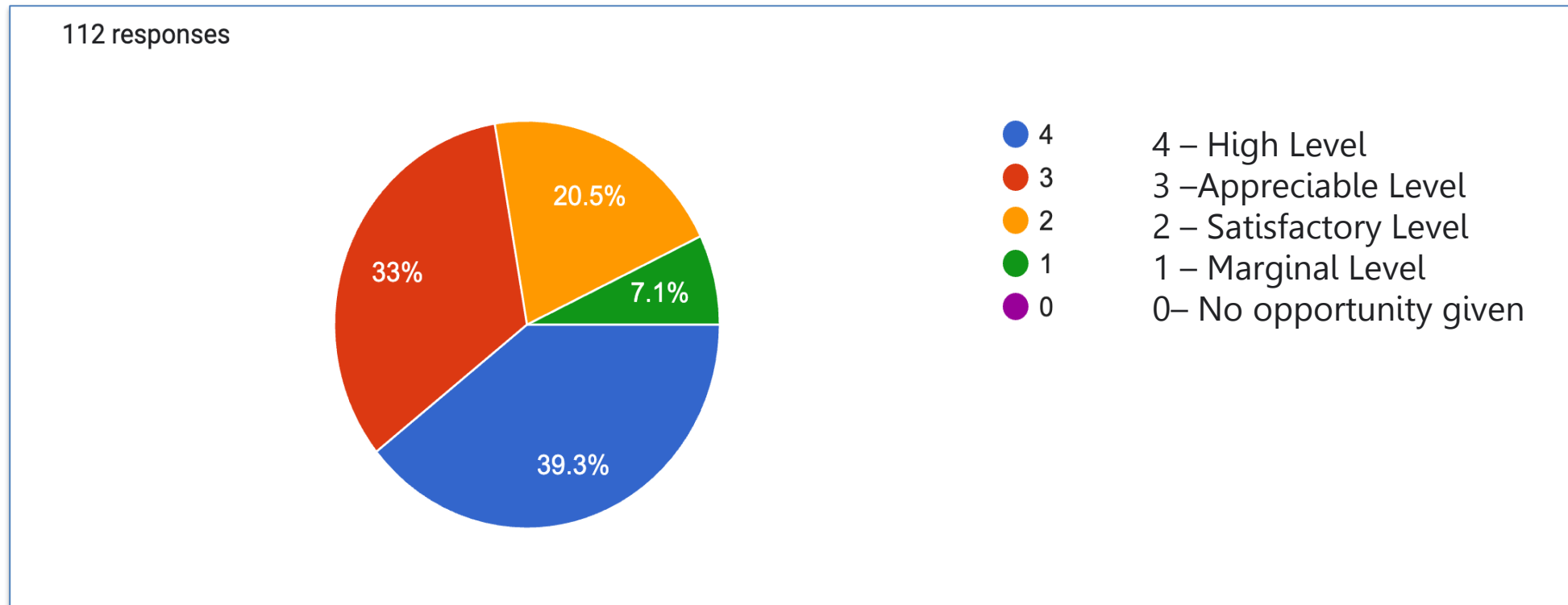


12. What is the level of opportunities provided by your institution to develop employability and entrepreneurship skills to prepare you for your career?



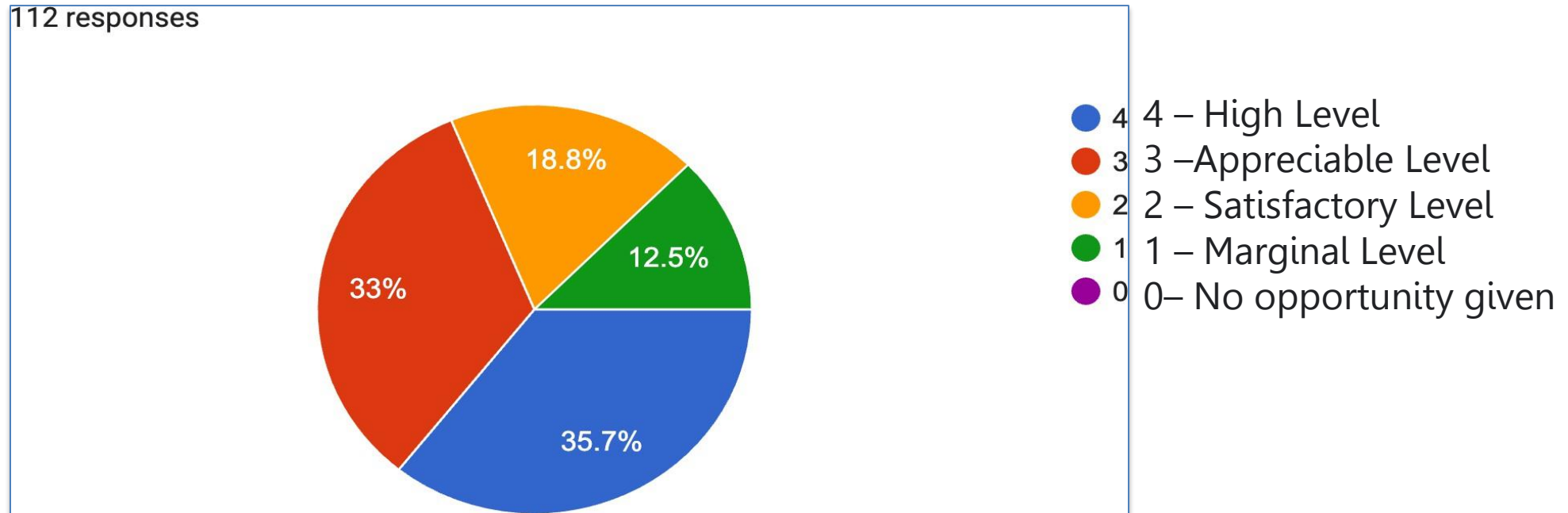

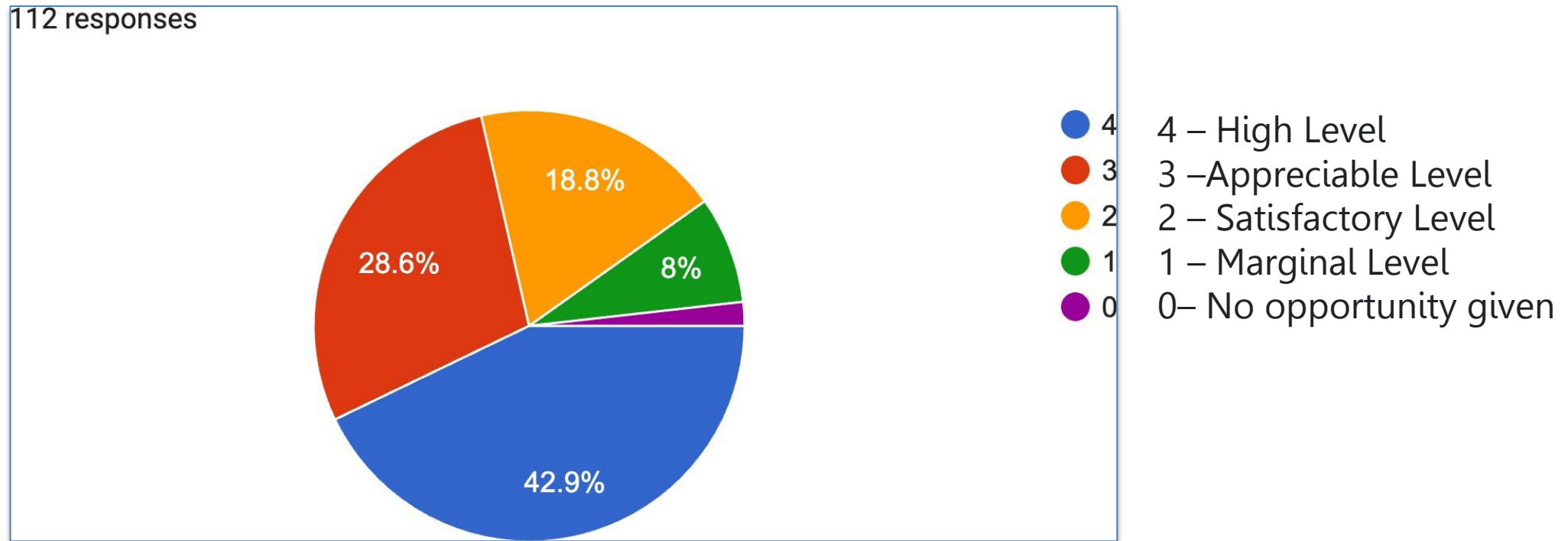

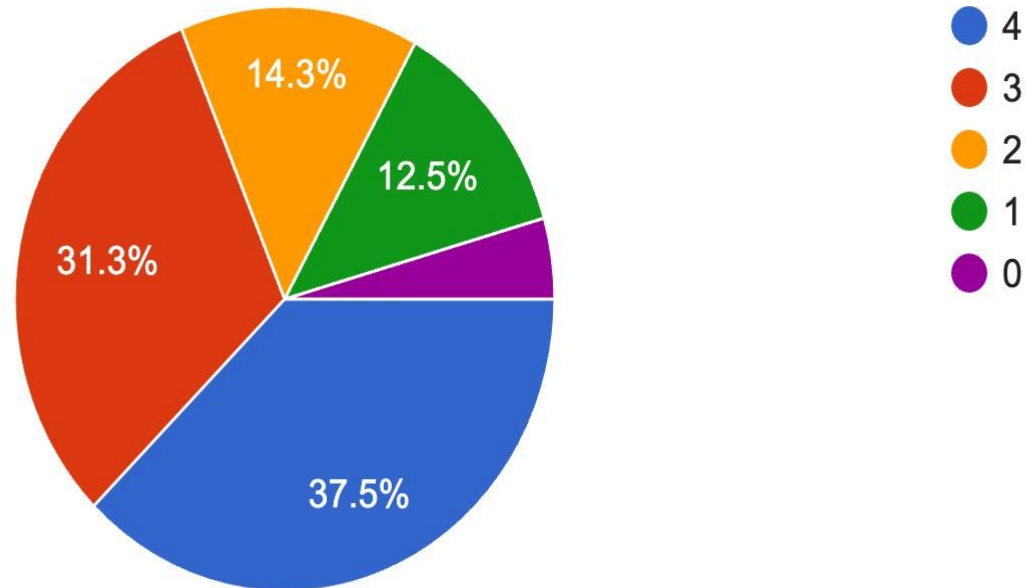

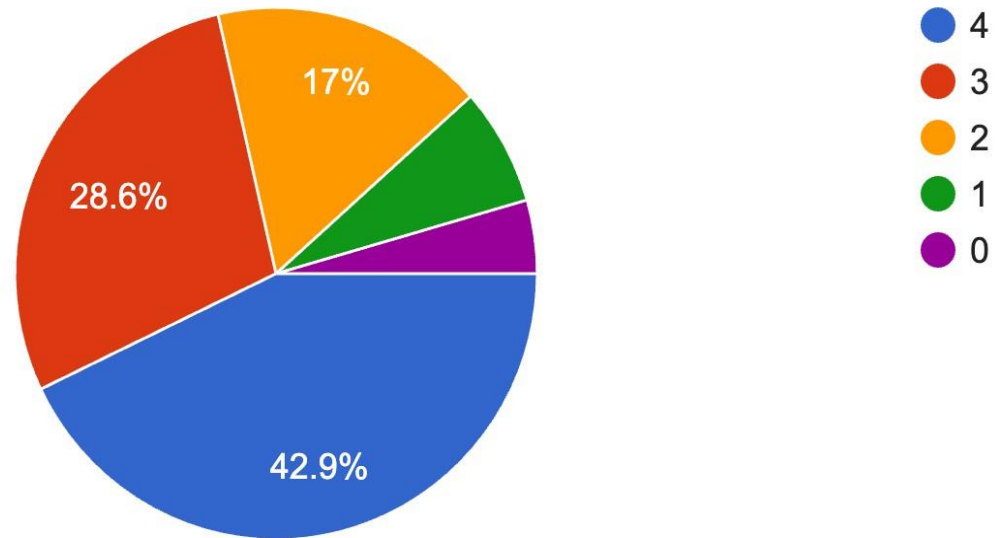

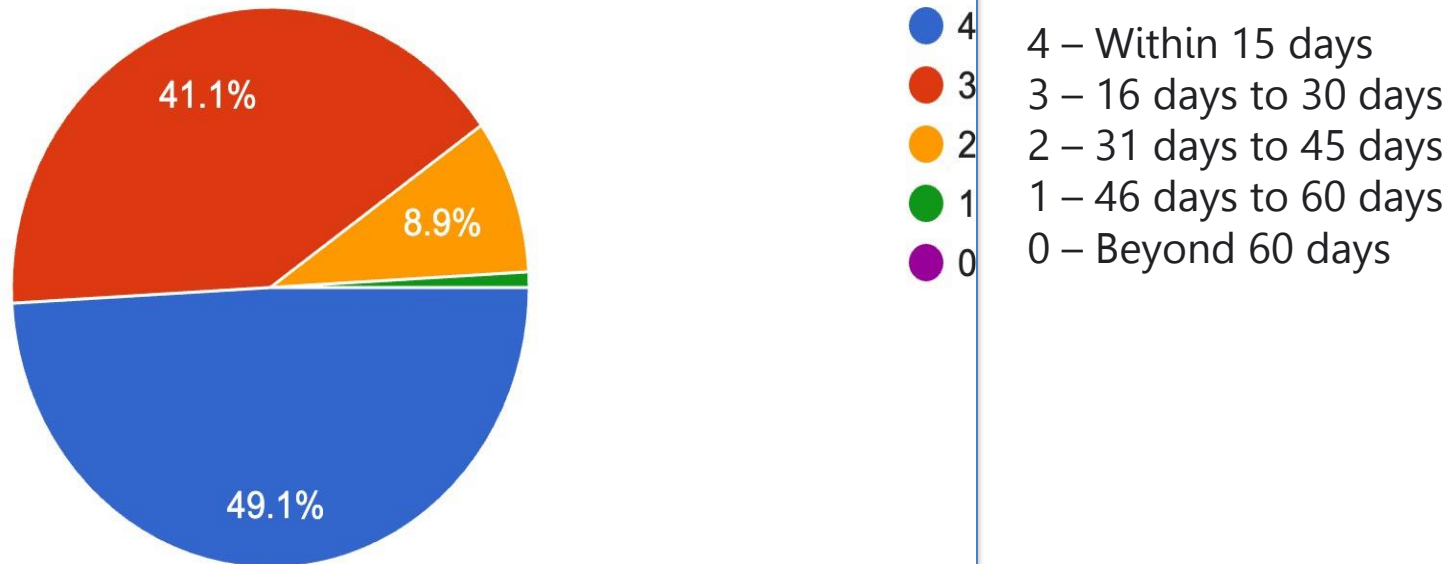

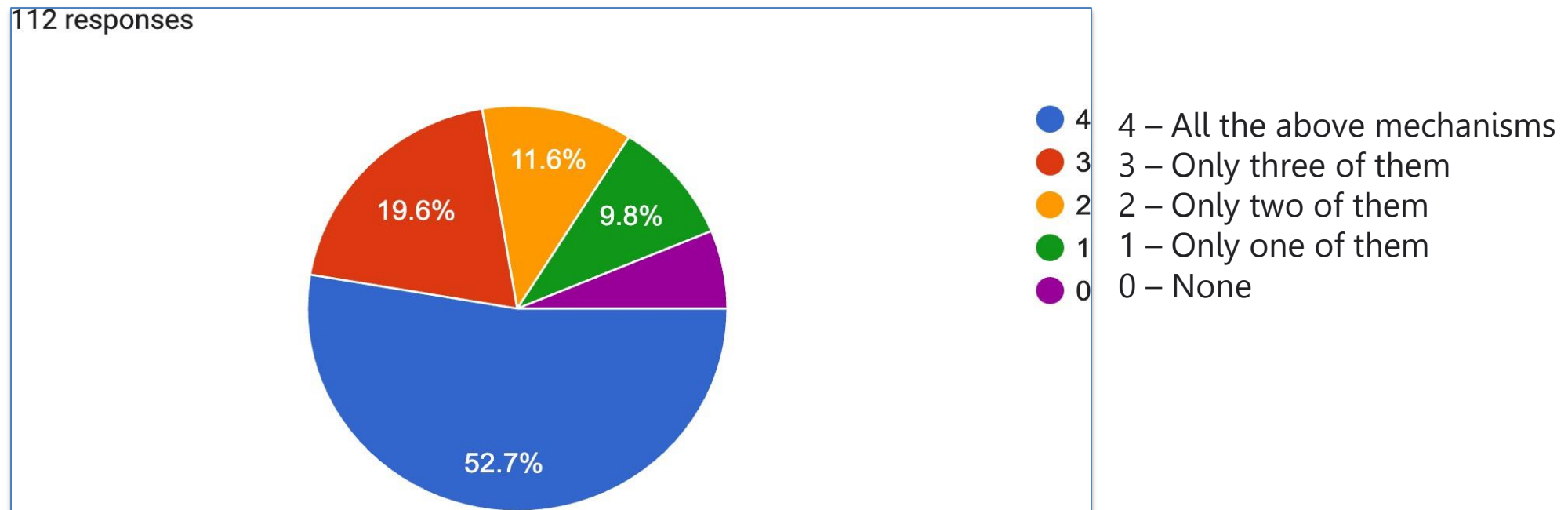

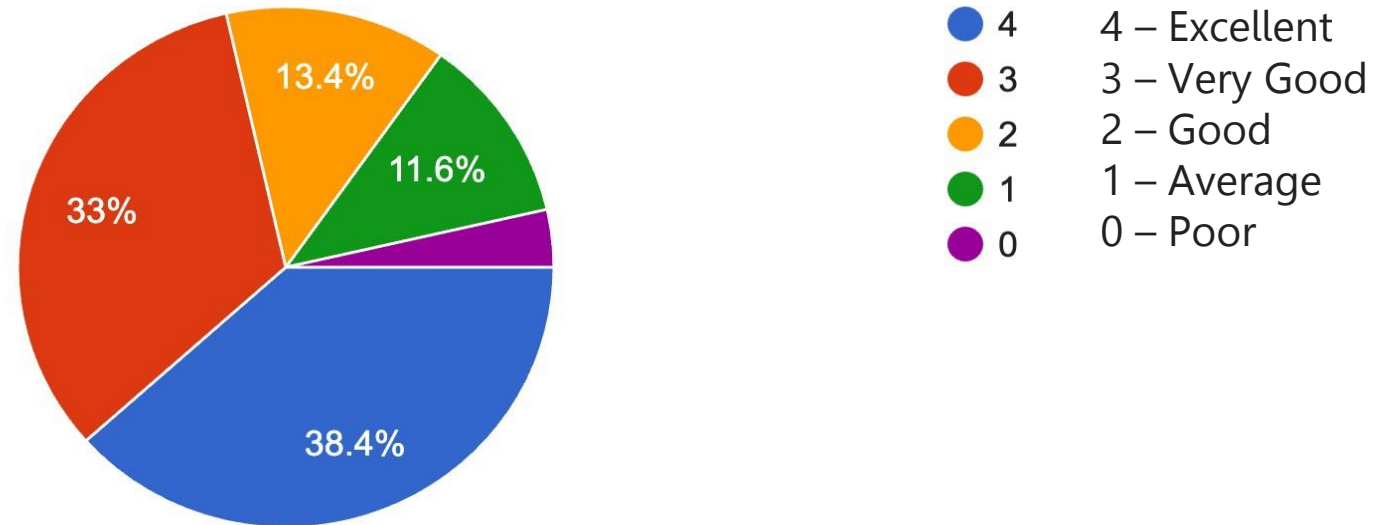

20. How do you rate the procedures involved in the pre examination, examination and post examination processes of the evaluation system adopted by your institution?

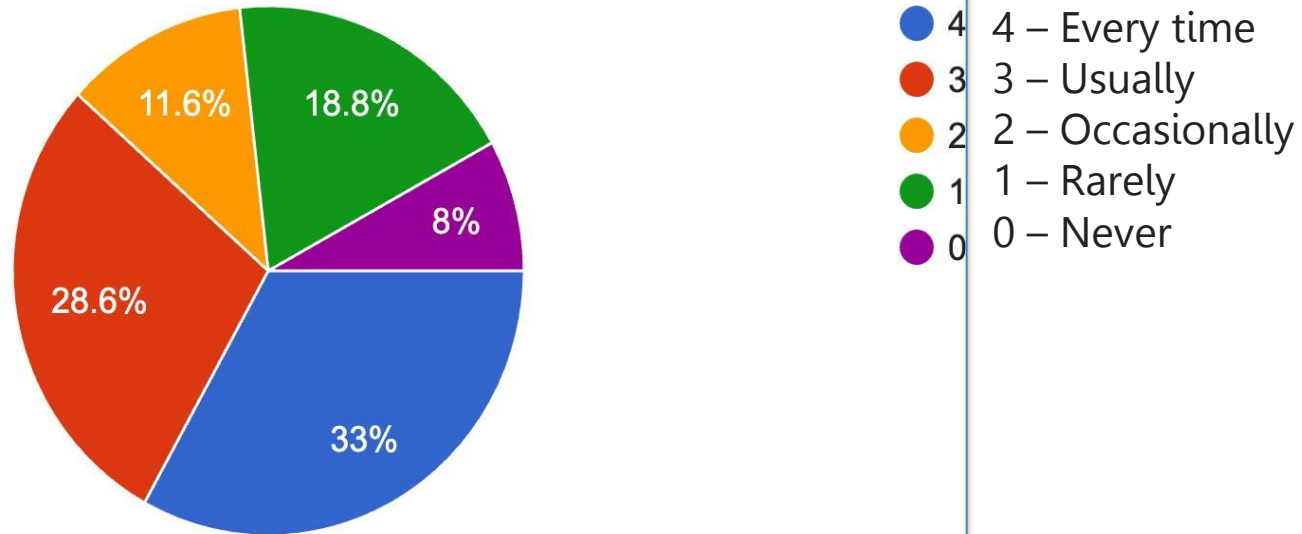

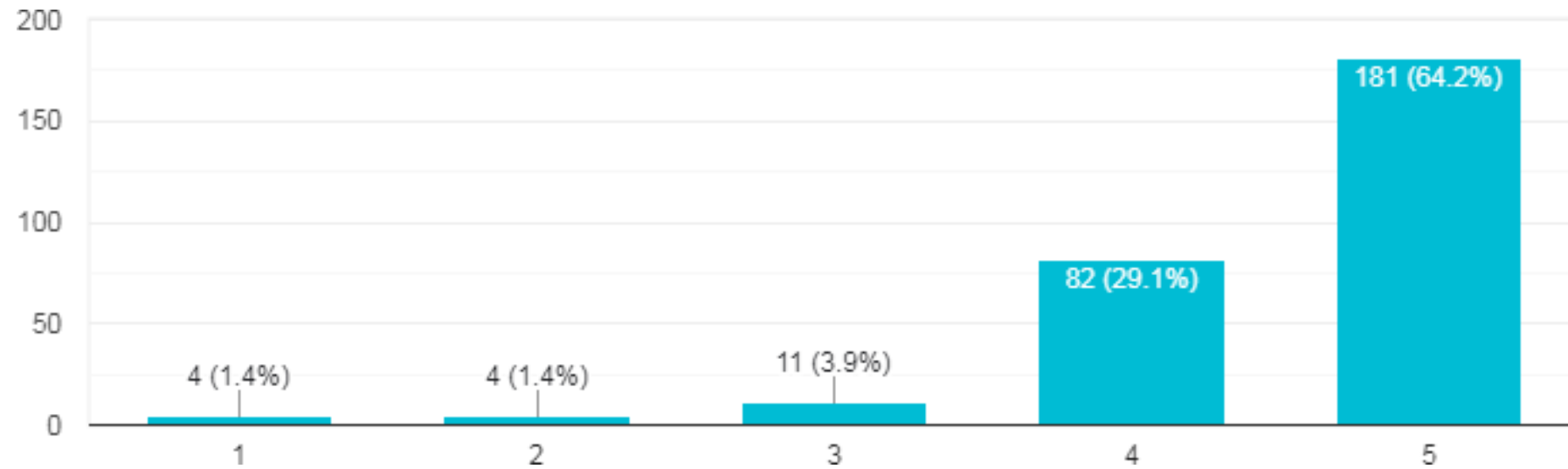


**Kindly rate the courses taught during your tenure in the University
(1 is poor, 5 is excellent)**



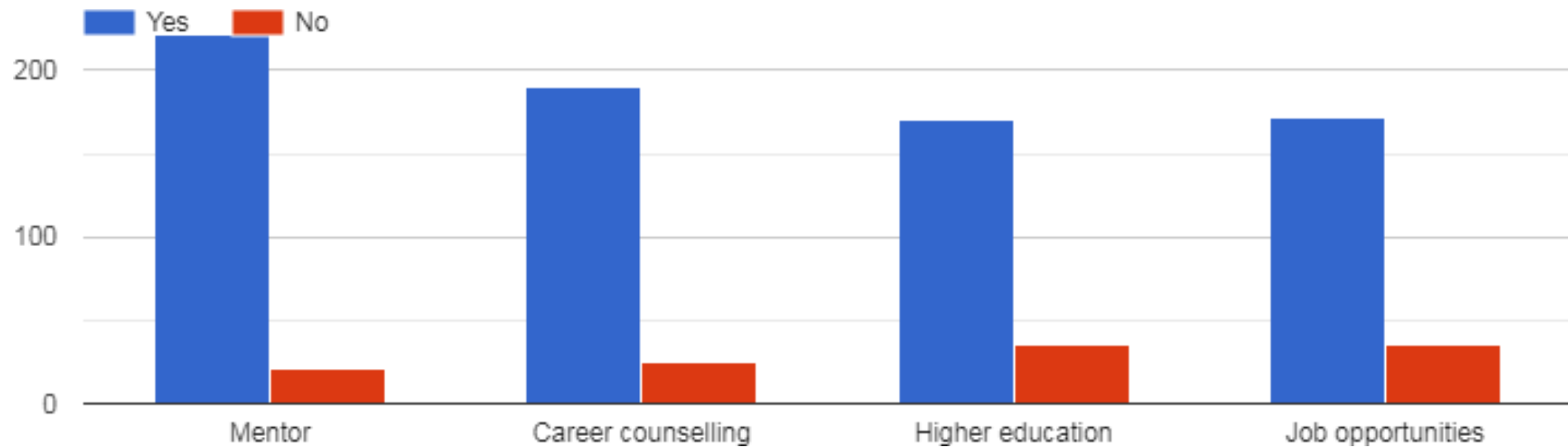


Overall rating of KGMU

Feedback from Employers [2023]

Majority of employers gave 5 points on a 5-point scale to the performance of their employees who are alumni of KGMU UP. They rate the performance for their Competence, Confidence, Adaptability, Professionalism, Team working, Leadership, Creativity and Relationship with seniors/peers/subordinates. Overall, they are fully satisfied with their performance.

REPORT on Feedback from External Examiners [2023]

Majority of examiners opined that the conduct of practical examination is excellent in terms of efficiency, transparency, objectivity and hospitality. They said that the conduct of practical examinations is as per regulatory authorities. **97.1% of the examiners** expressed that examination system of the university evaluate all domains of competency. Few examiners said that the examination process was very exhausting due to a smaller number of external examiners in proportion with the candidates.

Suggestions given by the External Examiners

For Clinical Departments:

- Patients with similar disease severity to be given
- Some students need clinical exposure more

For BDS:

- UG courses should be more clinical oriented. Teachers should spend a little more time for clinical teaching of BDS.

Regarding External Examiners:

- Number of examiners should be increased in proportion with students for proper evaluation

For Teaching & Learning activities of the university:

- Kindly improve the quality of teachers
- Interdisciplinary academic and clinical activities can be incorporated in the academic system

Regarding number of days for conduction of exam:

- Days can be increased so complete evaluation can be done.

For Examination pattern:

- The examination system should be made more objective and the accountability should be fixed on the examiners.
- OSCE/OSPE should be made mandatory and a well chalked out program for the practicals needs to be prepared to be uniformly followed by all.
- Evaluation Pattern can be changed time to time to break monotony.

For UG examination:

- As per NMC every student is to be examined by 4 examiners. So, every student being examined by 10 examiners seems to be an extra burden to student and also time consuming. So, some arrangement can be done, so that total number of days of exam can be reduced from 5.

For Supplementary examination

- Supplementary examination should be conducted after a gap of at least 3 months

Regarding Food quality & stay

- Need improvement. Some examiners suggested that KGMU should enter into a contract with hotels for stay of examiners like PGIMER and AIIMS

1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

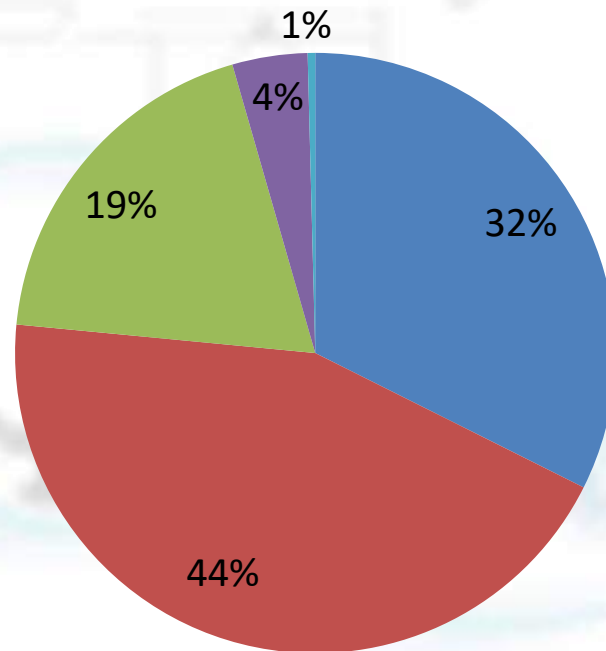

This is very discouraging for such students (like myself). Students who know 20-30% of the exam end up getting 80+ marks. Please change the exam pattern (sincere request). Please make it more objective (not just 10 mcqs). This will remove correction bias from examiner's end. More questions in objective can be made like match the following, one word answers.. And in subjective one line answers, enumeration. In this way knowledge will be thoroughly tested and students will prepare seriously rather than studying previous year important questions before exam. It will be easier for fair correction of answer sheets too. Please consider this.
